B. Instructions to Students

1. Eligibility

The District Ministerial Studies Board (DMSB), a division of the Board of Ministry, serves only students who are properly enrolled in the course of study. Enrollment is open only to local ministers, local lay ministers, and those described in Manual paragraph 503.1, or the *International Sourcebook on Developmental*

Standards for Ordained Ministers 436.3, and ministers of music who qualify according to Manual paragraph 511. Students should seek enrollment as soon as they receive their first local license from their local church or immediately upon transferring to the New Mexico District with a District License. For enrollment information, contact the Secretary as noted above.

2. Courses

The DMSB oversees the preparation of both elder and deacon candidates. Ministers will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses of study. It is the responsibility of the DMSB to oversee the academic preparation of the candidate for ordination. The District Board of Ministry is responsible to determine readiness for ordination and fitness for ministry. Thus, students should also understand that an interview for ordination is by invitation of the District Board of Ministry, not simply as a result of the completion of the educational requirements.

3. Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts college or university and, if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary (NTS) in Kansas City, Missouri. For those who already have a bachelor's degree in another field, we recommend enrollment in the ordination track Masters degree at NTS or at Point Loma Nazarene University. Courses completed at non-Nazarene colleges or universities may be presented to the secretary of the

DMSB for evaluation and possible credit toward the academic requirements for ordination upon approval of the Chairman of the DMSB.

Other modes include Nazarene Bible College through its online program, or the online program from Northwest Nazarene University, or through the District Training Center in alliance with NBC. Other modes of education may be allowed on a case by case basis through the DMBS or the chairman and secretary acting on their behalf providing that such is approved and in alignment with the Course of Study Advisory Committee (COSAC) requirements.

The District Training Center (DTC) is a classroom-based approach to ministerial education that is administered by Steven Michael Blea with courses being taught on the district. It operates in Alliance with Nazarene Bible College and offers college-level education for those preparing for ordination in a face-to-face setting. An added benefit is that courses taken through the DTC may be available for credit toward an academic degree through Nazarene Bible College. For information regarding the NMDTC, contact Rev. S. Michael Blea. Students may complete their educational requirements through a combination of approaches under the guidance of the DMSB.

The courses required of the college/university students are listed in Manual paragraph 527.1. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual paragraph 527.3.

4. Regulations for Course of Study

1. There is a minimum of 25 courses required for completion of the course of study as prescribed by the Manual.
2. Candidates are responsible for their education process and documentation and evidence for course completion rests on the shoulders of the student. Proper documentation and transcripts must be presented to DMSB in order for credit to be granted.
3. Candidates should be prepared to appear for an interview each year as called upon by the Board of Ministry or either of its subcommittees (Ministerial Studies Board/Ministerial Credentials Board) at the time and place specified. Each student is expected to communicate with the secretary of the DMSB in advance of this meeting to present documentation of completed courses.
4. The Manual 530.3, requires that each student complete a minimum of two courses per year to maintain district license.

5. College/University Students

College/university students are responsible to submit to the DMSB documentary evidence (official college transcript) of academic standing in harmony with Manual and the SMD (Sourcebook for Ministerial Development) 437.

College/university students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with Manual 528.2. Yearly updates should be submitted to the DMSB by the student showing completed course work. The final transcript at graduation will be evaluated by the DMSB, and requirements stated in the current Manual will not be

waived. Those students who graduate from a COSAC approved degree program will be automatically graduated from the Course of Study without further evaluation

6. Mentoring

When first granted a District License, each person pursuing ordination on the New Mexico District will be enrolled in the District Mentoring Program, currently under the direction of Rev. Ken Weisheit. The mentor will serve as the student's coach, advisor, and encourager during his or her preparation phase. Participation in the mentoring program is not optional and failure to meet the expectations of the mentoring program is considered cause for non-renewal of district license. Specific details regarding the mentoring program will be provided at the time of the candidate receiving his/her first district license.

C. Lifelong Learning

The following Manual paragraphs outline the responsibility of all ordained Elders and Deacons to develop and maintain a pattern of Lifelong Learning.

515.12. Nurture his or her own call through the years of ministry, maintain a life of personal devotion that enriches his or her own soul, and, if married, guard the integrity and vitality of that marriage relationship.

529.6. Once a minister has fulfilled the requirements of a validated course of study for ministry, he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry to which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 hours of lifelong learning each year or the equivalent determined by the region/language group and stated in their regional Sourcebook on Ordination. All assigned and unassigned licensed and ordained ministers shall report on their progress in a program of lifelong learning as part of their report to the district assembly. An up-to-date report on his or her lifelong learning program will be used in the church/pastoral relationship review process and in the process of calling a pastor. The regional Sourcebook on Ordination for the region/ language group will contain the details of the accrediting and reporting process.

529.7. Failure to complete the lifelong learning requirements for more than two consecutive years shall result in the ordained minister being required to meet with the District Ministerial Studies Board at its regular meeting time. The District Ministerial Studies Board shall give guidance to the minister in completing the lifelong learning required.

Each ordained minister is encouraged to create a profile at <http://nazarene.org/lifelong-learning> and create a personal profile. Each minister is responsible to maintain his or her lifelong learning record through this registry. The DBMS will register certain district events for

credit at this registry; but will not update anyone's profile. Each minister must maintain his/her own record.

A. District Superintendent's Annual Report

Report of the Superintendent To the 108th Assembly Of the New Mexico District

Many years ago, I spent a summer travelling around the country running sound for a travelling singing group called Discovery which was sponsored by the Church of the Nazarene. It was a summer of adventure as we travelled the country in two sky blue fifteen-passenger vans pulling an equipment trailer doing concerts in camps, churches, city plazas, and, even, NYI Convention. I have no idea how many miles we travelled that summer, but we literally travelled from coast to coast and corner to corner around the USA.

On one particularly difficult day of travelling, I was driving one of the vans. Frankly, I did not even know where we were. I just knew that we were trying to get from North Carolina to Pennsylvania somewhere. Well, we ran into the worst road construction I think I have ever run into. The interstate highway we were on suddenly slowed down to a one lane road, then, to a dirt road, twisting through the mountains. "Where in the world are we," was the question on everyone's mind. Finally, the construction came to an end after about two hours of twists, stops, and dust, and we pulled off at a gas station to get gas and to use the facilities. It was there that our journey became clear to us. As we walked into the gas station, there in the window hung the t-shirt that explained it all. It said, "I survived the West-Virginia Turnpike."

Some of you here probably have a t-shirt that says, "I survived NYC 1995" where the temperature in Phoenix soared to 120 degrees in the shade and there was no shade. Personally, I had to suffer in Switzerland for my International Institute in 1974. I had to wear a coat half the time. You can go ahead and be jealous!

In many ways today, it would feel right to hand out “I survived Covid-19” t-shirts to everyone here. The problem is, that’s not funny, since most of us know someone who did not survive Covid-19. I would not for a moment want to minimize the losses that this year has brought to our lives and our churches.

And we have lost three of our own—not to COVID. However, we have suffered the loss of three great leaders in Len Marjerison, Darryl Tennesfos, and Paul Baker, three of our great servants of the church on the district, adding insult to injury.

Would it be ok, however, at this juncture to say, “The church survived Covid-19,” or, even, “the New Mexico District survived Covid-19,” or, even better, “The churches of the New Mexico District found ways to thrive through Covid-19?”

Psalm 92:

*¹² The righteous **thrive** like a palm tree
and grow like a cedar tree in Lebanon.*

*¹³ Planted in the house of the LORD,
they **thrive** in the courts of our God.*

*¹⁴ They will still bear fruit in old age,
healthy and green,*

*¹⁵ to declare, “The LORD is just;
he is my rock,
and there is no unrighteousness in him.”*

So, what are some of the ways our churches found to **thrive** this year?

Bonita Park

You will hear more from Connor and Brenda in their report from Bonita Park and I do not want to steal their thunder, but I do want to say how proud I am of the way they have led that ministry through these difficult days. Not only were they able to navigate the waters of both PPP loans, the state grant, and individual contributions, which provided virtually the only income we had this year, they were able to leverage what funds and resources we had to use the down time to make multiple improvements to the infrastructure of the camp so that we emerged from the shut-down stronger than ever and ready for business. I am proud to say that people love Bonita Park. During and because of COVID, we received a whopping \$139,542 given by 50 doners including 2 NM district churches, which gave nearly \$34,000 for operations, and four non-Nazarene churches, which contributed over \$25,000 for operations. Most recently, one of our non-Nazarene donors sent a \$90,000 check because he sensed in his heart that we probably weren’t completely financially whole after such a devastating year.

The District

The district actually reduced spending this year because we were forced to have many of our regular meetings via zoom. I also was prevented from traveling to a number of meetings that I am normally required to travel to around the country such as Point Loma, District Superintendent Conferences, General Church meetings etc. And, while I was still present physically in thirty-five of our churches, some multiple times, and I traveled 30,000 miles on the district, my ability to be out and about on the district was curtailed somewhat. As a result, the district spent less money this year. For me, this job has given me a front row seat to all that God is doing on this district and all I can say is that you people are amazing!

We had budgeted to bring in \$30,000 less from churches as well this year, and it looks like we will hit our target, even with reduction in church income due to COVID-19. Actually, we came in quite a bit over what we had budgeted, ending the year with an income of nearly \$140,000. Please congratulate yourselves. We also received a \$10,000 special offering from Rio Communities Lighthouse when they sold their gymnasium building. That, coupled with savings in the budget last year and, \$15,000 from the district's PPP loan, and the sale of the Prayer Mobile, means that we have been able to restore over \$79,000. this year of the designated funds balance which was in arrears for over \$120,000 when I came into this job two years ago getting us to a place where we have restored virtually all fund balances in all accounts. Larry Fry will talk more about this in his report. These fund balances are being secured in a separate savings account so that they cannot be intermingled with working capital, thereby making sure it is there when we need it for the projects and purposes for which they have been set aside. I want to thank you for your faithfulness during these difficult days. As of today, 23 of 34 churches have paid their district budgets in full and 33 of 34 churches have made an effort to pay something on their district budgets.

Would you congratulate with me all these churches, who in a very difficult year, were able to rise to the challenge to make sure that all their missional apportionments were paid in full: District, Pensions, Education, and World Evangelism Fund:

THANK YOU for your faithfulness in a difficult year. There were many others who were close and may have, in fact, made the “paid in full” category, but we were missing some income numbers or something in order to complete your report. What amazes me is how faithful virtually all our churches were in a year in which you might have had a good excuse not to be.

We had also dwindled our Nazarene Foundation Account down to about \$5000. Currently, that account stands at \$26,707.33. It is not a vast improvement, but it is an improvement. We are moving in the right direction. We win *together* as a team.

While the financial well-being of our district is important, and you have helped me dig us out of a deep hole over these past two years, and we have every reason to celebrate that. The critical number to celebrate, especially in this past year is the fact that we have reported 236 people brought into the Kingdom through conversion to Christ in a year when we were told to shut the church down. Thirty-two of our churches reported that someone was led to faith in Christ through their ministry this year. Praise the Lord. Leading the way was Pastor David West of Farmington Crossroads, reporting 55 new Christians. If you have never been there for their Super Sunday, it is a site to behold. Next in line was Graciela Ramos Chaves, who reported 40 new Christians. I don’t know for sure, but I suspect most of those were people that her husband, Antonio, led to the Lord in jail. After that we celebrate the 25 led to Jesus through the ministry of Clovis Living Stones and the 20 led to the Lord through our African church, Revival and Compassion Ministries. While the budgets pay the bills, it’s the souls that pay the dividends. Congratulations to all of you who brought in the harvest during this difficult year.

One of the things I love about being District Superintendent is that I get to drive around the district and visit the churches that are doing so many amazing and creative things to expand the Kingdom. This year, I Zoomed around the district as well, having had more Zoom meetings with more people than I can possibly recount. One of the particularly enjoyable Zoom sessions was with Silver City Mountainview Church. Brother Earseye Ross asked if I would do a zoom membership class for him, since he still didn’t feel comfortable with all the material and he needed to take in some new members quickly—his treasurer was moving to Florida. Well, we

made it happen one Saturday, and you will see by his report that the membership of his church has doubled this year. What won't show up until next year are the five baptisms that he had on June 12. He invited me to come be a part of that service, but I had a previous commitment. What I can say is that since we made a Nazarene out of that man, there's been a whole lot of shakin' going on in Silver City.

The district is not our only responsibility, however. We are part of a global network of churches. I am proud to represent the New Mexico District as a trustee to Point Loma Nazarene University. I can say, without fear of contradiction, that PLNU is our school. It is a place that works for us each and every day, seeking to provide resources to strengthen local churches in New Mexico by equipping pastors, students, and churches to serve Christ and the Kingdom during challenging days in a way that is faithful to scripture and our Wesleyan Holiness heritage. I can assure you that each and every dollar you send in your educational budget is spent to enable Nazarene students to attend Point Loma Nazarene University. So, send in your educational budget, definitely. Also, send your students there; enable your pastors to go there for days of learning and refreshing; and do your Master's degree there. You won't be sorry.

Nicole has already talked to you about the importance of the World Evangelism Fund. Let me just reiterate here. We are a global church. In fact, the Church of the Nazarene is a uniquely global church. That is true, mostly because you have been consistently faithful throughout the years to invest in the World Evangelism Fund. Only heaven can calculate the way the world has changed because of the faithful dollars given to missions by US Nazarenes. Let's not slow down now. We are winning. Let's press the advantage.

Church Planting

In the midst of this crazy year, Tammie Summers approached me and said that she was feeling that God was calling her to plant a church in Bloomfield, New Mexico. I thought that was interesting because I had been thinking about Bloomfield ever since I first went into San Juan County and Ken Weisheit and I talked about his burden to have a church in Bloomfield. In fact, as I looked at San Juan County, I began to dream about at least five churches in the county. Still, I tried to push her off—you know, COVID and San Juan County being one of the worst counties in the state in terms of the infection rate. Well, she kept pushing and the Crossroads church said they were willing to offer some families and their money (unheard of when you are suffering financial cutbacks in a community). Still Dave is Kingdom-minded and willing to do whatever it takes, so we began to plan a Church Planting Training event for the Bloomfield Group.

Well, by the time we had it organized, Pete, being Pete, had three more groups that might be interested in starting churches in the Albuquerque area (after all, we need forty churches in the five-county area around Albuquerque) and Rick Hutchison decided that he might jump in with two new ones of his own in the Angus area, plus the one that he already had going in Albuquerque, and the next thing you know, we have Vision Action Plans for one church in Bloomfield, one in Edgewood, one teen church in Albuquerque, one House Church in

Albuquerque, one House Church in Angus, and dreams of one in Capitan, and, oh yeah, Albuquerque Valley is working on a Spanish church, El Paso Imagine will open in August, Rio Communities wants to start a work in Belen, and there's 196,000 people in Rio Rancho and we have yet to establish one church there.

Here's my vision: Forty churches in the five-county area around Albuquerque, forty churches in Texas, starting in El Paso and following the Rio Grande south, and forty churches in the rest of the state. Many of the new ones will be Spanish-speaking. I also want to create some cooperative networking with SW Latin and SW Native districts to enhance the Kingdom impact of all three districts as they overlap on the NM district. We have several of our churches that host churches for the SW Latin District in their buildings. Portales may be the next.

Toward that end, I am proposing a realignment of our Mission Areas (what used to be called zones years ago). One thing we must do as a district is to get back on the offensive for the Kingdom of God. As an attachment to this report and in the district journal, you will see our new Mission Area alignment with their mission area pastors and the job descriptions of the MAPs. Don't turn there now. When you have time to look at it, you will see that we are thinking differently about the church, the district, and the Kingdom as we move forward from this point. I am energized as I have been having conversation with the District Advisory Board and the Mission Areas as we have been envisioning how we will begin to thrive again as a district.

Let me tell you something about the church I grew up in and the church I was trained to lead. In those days, pastors were given churches to lead, and we all competed to see who could grow the biggest churches. I grew up in the days of Sunday School contests, "fill a pew Sundays" and other gimmicks to get folks in the building. I took my first ride in an airplane because I brought the most people to church (the Post family) during a bus contest. Funny thing was, I didn't even know they had come until it was announced that I had won. I remember when Sunday school classes competed against each other to see which one could grow the most. I also remember when church A competed against church B or zone A competed against zone B to see which one could grow the most over the quarter.

Now, while I'm sure these contests and things got people to church and many even got people to heaven (by all means win some, right), in the end they created a certain pathology that was unhealthy. It created a spirit of competition between churches in which churches would not cooperate with each other; but, rather, would rejoice when other churches failed, especially if our own churches were succeeding. As pastors, dare I say, we were tempted to get into the business of building our own personal kingdoms instead of building the Kingdom of God. We were filled with envy when our brothers and sisters were seeing good days and harbored jealousy in our hearts when "less worthy" people got "better assignments" that we felt we were more qualified for.

Friends, that has to change. We have to have a change of heart, attitude, and purpose. We must think of the New Mexico District as One Rope, Many Hands. We are One Church. We are just touching it in different places. It is not your church, my church. It is God's church—"One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism. One God and Savior of us all." One rope. We are all pulling on the same rope—just at different locations.

Right now, we have the following churches in development on the New Mexico District—That is, they are registered churches, but not yet fully organized:

here are at least three or four others in the developmental stage and several more in the dream stage, From San Juan County, to El Paso County. Therefore, let's communicate better, love each other deeper, and have a common strategy so that we can all be pulling in the same direction. Then, when anyone wins, we all win and, when anyone struggles, there are those who are nearby to help them up. The plan and purpose is simple, however—pray sincerely, love deeply, and build the kingdom strategically.

We did vote to close Holiday Park church this year. After many years of hard labor, those who were a part of that church, simply felt that they could not continue. However, we did not sell the building. I have worshipped twice this year with the African Church, Revival and Compassion Ministries Church of the Nazarene in the building and 125 African Nazarenes who were worshipping with the joy that only Africans do. And, with the help of the Sandia church, that building has become a Neighborhood Resource Center out of which new ministries are beginning to spring up, giving us opportunity to continue to minister out of the investment that has been made over the years at that location.

Speaking of building the Kingdom strategically, we have neglected the Texas part of our district for too long. I was shocked to return to New Mexico and to see the growth in the city of El Paso

while our churches were fading away. Not counting the city of Juarez, the El Paso Metropolitan area is right at 900,000 people. That means that the part of Texas that is on the New Mexico District comprises 1/5 of the district's land mass and over 1/3 of its population. Yet, we have only five churches in Texas. There was a time when the Texas part of the New Mexico District was the strongest part of the district, numerically and financially.

As we have been dreaming about changing that situation, God sent us Chuck and Renee Parish. Chuck was appointed as our director of Mission El Paso and the Parishes took over the Nuevo Amanecer church and a New Church Start and began rebuilding it and the other churches in El Paso. Nuevo became *Imagine* church and has begun making inroads in their community toward an opening, probably in August. Additionally, Chuck and Renee have been working to rebuild trust, friendship, prayer, and love among the pastors in our churches in El Paso as well as with our missionaries working with the Border Initiative.

I can say that the atmosphere in the body in El Paso today is much different than it was when I first visited two years ago. Yet, what we have is just a good beginning. My vision for the district has been that we establish forty churches in Texas. Accomplishing that goal will require more than just feeling good about each other. Therefore, today I am prepared to announce phase two of our plan for Texas which I am calling "Thrust to Texas," or T3, for short. Our plan involves moving a church planting missionary into El Paso. That missionary will have the specific assignment of planting churches in Texas, beginning in El Paso and marching down the Rio Grande, while continuing to facilitate the launching of churches throughout the New Mexico portion of our district, working especially with our Mission Area Pastors to do so.

Missional Intent

Your assembly handbook is filled with pastors' written reports of ways in which God has been working in their churches this year. We will not take time to have each pastor verbalize his or her report this year, but I want to take time to highlight some of the things that I have seen.

First of all, in no case did our churches just hunker down this year and try to survive somehow. Each and every church on the district understood that it had a mission to fulfill and the gates of Covid would not prevail against it. In general, our churches all learned to become digitally present in some form or fashion. It was wonderful to see Facebook become a tool for the Gospel. There were Sundays when Facebook seemed to be overwhelmed by so many church streams that it could not handle them all.

YouTube became GodTube. Cell phones became broadcast devices, websites became broadcast stations, and parking lots filled with flashing lights and honked "amens." Semi beds became band stands, and hay bales became platform chairs as pastors became masked avengers of the gospel and children's directors zoomed into children's homes five days a week. For a time there, I was attending six services on Sunday, beginning with my

children's churches in Indiana and Illinois and ending with three different services here on the district. If I missed one, I could always go back and catch the YouTube feed later.

Besides Sunday services, we have zoomed Bible studies, watched Facebook devotionals, Wednesday night web services, and YouTube services of every kind, from living room chats to choral presentations.

Many of our churches continued to find ways to operate their ministries of compassion in social-distanced ways. Our NMI and Sandia Valley took food and water out to the reservations around Albuquerque while Chris Davis continued to take food, wood, water, and supplies to the reservations around Gallup with the funding, mostly of Bethany First Church. She even found a way to reopen the Grants work since she had so much spare time on her hands. Carlsbad Church Street opened their new compassionate ministry center called The Blessing. I had the opportunity to dedicate that facility and about 8 babies in December as old First church was reformed into a new kind of ministry for that community.

As you read through the reports in the Handbook, you will see that most of our churches have formed some sort of ministry of compassion to their community out of which they became Jesus to the least, the last, and the lost at the margins. I wish I had time for all the stories. They are in the book—take a look. If you have a CMC in or through your church, would you please stand...

We had drive-in votes for two new pastors. I'm still deciding if Tim Tharp and Chris Tiner are legit. I know that those two and Nate Bienhoff are still waiting for their "welcome to our church potluck." I'm sure they still don't recognize half their congregations except for their eyes. It has been difficult for all our pastors to have to stay out of the hospitals, funeral homes, and the homes of the dying and the ill. We have done ministry gagged and with both hands tied behind our backs.

Almost every one of our churches reported that they were reaching people remotely that they had not seen in years or that they were reaching people who had moved away, or, even, that they were reaching people in other countries. Tularosa reported that they were reaching forty people in Pakistan via Facebook Live.

Other churches found low tech ways to keep in touch. Some of our churches used the telephone to keep in touch with seniors, hosting weekly Sunday school classes via teleconferences. Roswell First sent out a newsletter each week called "The Paper Shepherd" to make sure that no one got left behind.

Angus built a new worship center so that they could accommodate more people under the new restrictions. Virtually everyone reconfigured their sanctuaries to accommodate the ever-changing rules for gathering as they came down from above.

It has been difficult, and not everyone has been happy about the restrictions; but our pastors have done their best to step into that middle space to serve their churches while following the laws as they have been handed down by the governor and interpreted by the DS in the midst of a heated election when not all churches felt obligated to follow the same rules.

It is time, to “put the past in our behind,” to quote Timon, and think about how we create forward missional thrust in the New Mexico District again as we are allowed to open the doors of our churches again and welcome those who have gone away, been away, stayed away, ran away, and drifted away knowing that if we go back to business as usual, they are probably not going to mosey back in in any significant number.

Jeremiah found himself and his people in a situation similar to ours. For different reasons, the prevailing culture around them had changed. For the Jews, they had been deported into an environment in which no one spoke the same language, worshipped the same gods, followed the same traditions, or held the same values they had grown up with. What the prophets of the day were telling the Jews was, “Just hunker down for a few years and, soon, God will make everything go back to the way it was.” If you are familiar with Jeremiah chapter 29, you know that Jeremiah was telling his people not to listen to those “pie in the sky by and by” prophets.

While he is certain to affirm in 29:11 that God is a God of good plans and that He has no intention of bringing harm to His people, earlier in the chapter, Jeremiah is careful to explain that those plans are going to be executed in the midst of Babylon, not by taking them back to the “good ‘ol days” in Jerusalem. His advice, 29:7—“Pursue the well-being of the city I have deported you to. Pray to the LORD on its behalf, for when it thrives, you will thrive.”

Now, I have already given a long report of many of the ways I have see the churches of the New Mexico District working to do just what Jeremiah was advising the Jews to do at another time when the world had turned on its head, so I won’t preach the sermon that I want to preach out of this passage.

This COVID-19 pause in the life of the Church has given us some time to pause and to reflect a bit. It has been a rare opportunity to stop doing everything we were doing and to ask, “What should we be doing,” or “What must we be doing to be the church?” As I have read through your pastor’s reports, I see that many of your churches took time to ask those kinds of questions. I know that the General Superintendents have been asking those questions and the district superintendents have been asking those questions. Even Point Loma has been asking those questions.

Those of you who have joined me for Leadership Zoom on Mondays have “Canoed the Mountains” with me and have grappled with “life off the map.” In the process, we have asked, “What is essential to being church in this messed-up culture in which we find ourselves today?”

Jeremiah has given us the secret to thriving in a hostile environment. “Pursue the well-being of the city I have deported you to. Pray to the Lord on its behalf.”

Isn't that the lesson of 2020? If we were given 2020 hindsight, isn't that what we have all universally seen? “If the church doesn't find ways to get outside it's doors, it's going to be out of business in no time.” And, “What you see when you engage your community is going to make you pray or its going to make you cry.”

Last year, I talked about four pillars of Awakening: Passionate Throne-ward Worship, Intentional Corporate Prayer, Deliberate Discipleship, and Intentional Engagement with the Broken in your Community. I fully still believe that these pillars support the Awakening of the Church. However, I have come to think of them not so much as pillars, but as tires. Pillars hold something up. Tires mobilize something. It is the something, that we need to see if we are going to have a future. The “something” is *Mission*.

If you don't know your mission, you don't have a church. Mission will be everything going forward. In fact, people will join your mission, before they join your Jesus, before they join your church. That's exactly the opposite of the way I was taught to do church. I was taught to get people to church, then get them saved, then find them a job.

Maybe we have become the church in exile. Maybe that's good news. If you want to know what to do next, Jeremiah's marching orders are very simple: *7Pursue the well-being of the city I have deported you to. Pray to the LORD on its behalf, for when it thrives, you will thrive.*

As Casting Crowns declared,
*Just to know You and to make You known
We lift Your name on high
Shine like the sun, make darkness run and hide
We know we were made for so much more than ordinary lives
It's time for us to more than just survive
We were made to thrive.*

I believe we are entering a “thrive” stage for the New Mexico District and, if you will have me, I would love to continue to work with you to see what God can do in this amazing place.

Greetings to the New Mexico District!

Last year at this time we were embarking upon an unknown COVID-19 pandemic journey for which none of us had any idea what to expect. This year we find ourselves still dealing with some impacts of COVID but with hopes of normalcy on the horizon.

At the June 2021 SDMI Convention we are delighted to have Dr. Scott Rainey, Global Director, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) as our guest speaker. Although he was with us last year online, this year we are privileged to have Dr. Rainey with us in person. We are looking forward to hearing about his vision and direction for the Global SDMI Team.

Women's Retreat: Our Women's Ministries Director is DeAnn Rushing and she leads our District Women's Retreat. DeAnn reports: Women's retreat was real - even though it was virtual. God's Spirit moved among the ladies. One breakout group leader said about her group, "Jesus spoke to them in great ways. . . . It was a blessing. . . .they were listening to Jesus and courageous to be vulnerable. It was really good. This was a great event. . . . It made a difference for the ladies in my group." Worship was awesome led live by Lizzie Wenrich. The messages from Susie Shellenberger were powerful and effective. Testimonies have come in of new commitments made and lives impacted from these messages. How great it was to be able to gather through zoom! We had somewhere around 250 ladies attend. Next year is even going to be better, meeting in person at Bonita Park on March 25-27, 2022!!! Choose to be with Carrie Wisheart as she leads us to choose The Best Day Ever Adventure.

Man Camp: Thank you to Eric Zottneck for his past leadership of Man Camp. We are very pleased to welcome Rev. Wade Elftman as the New Mexico Man Camp Director. Wade led his first Man Camp in 2021 and he did a great job. Wade reports: Man Camp

2021 was hosted in-person at Bonita Park March 23-25. This year's speaker was Dr. Gavin Fothergill, who is the pastor at Valleyview Church of the Nazarene in Amarillo, TX, and a former Missionary in Africa. There was a total of 76 men attended the camp. Men ranging in age from 5 years old to our most senior mentors and everywhere in between. The camp included a lot of fun around Bonita Park, Archery Tag, a hike, fellowship, eating, and Spirit lead services and worship. The theme around the services challenged the men to a "Higher Calling" debunking the myth that there is no such thing as a "super-Christian" but that we are called to serve God in every capacity of our lives. Man Camp 2022 is scheduled for April 22-24 at Bonita Park so put that date on your calendar. We look to seeing a great turn out of men from across the district.

Adult Ministries: Tamara Bailey serves as our Adult Ministries Director. Tamara spoke at our 2020 SDMI Convention and we are excited to see her vision unfold for Adult Ministries. Tamara has identified a couple of candidate events that you will likely be hearing about.

Children's Ministry: Jessica Zottneck has done a great job leading our district children's ministry for many years. Unfortunately, Jessica resigned in 2021. Thank you to Jessica for all the great work she has done these many years leading our children's ministry. I am very pleased that Diana Bloomquist accepted the role to lead our NM district children's ministry. Diana is a longtime Nazarene and leads children's ministry at Heights First Church in Albuquerque. She holds a degree in Elementary Education from NM State. Diana teaches kindergarten and first grade and has a deep love for children. She and her husband, Eric, have 2 children. Kid's Camp and District Children's quizzing fall within Children's Ministries.

Kid's Camp: Pastor Ron Davis heads up our Kids Camp and has had to deal with a lot of ambiguity and tough decisions during Covid. Ron and his team are highly vested in our kids and they know that many lifelong decisions for Christ are made during the wonderful times at camp. Due to issues such as Covid restrictions, social distance requirements and unavailability of camp staff, the NM District kids camp will look different this year. It was a very difficult decision for the camp team but after much pray and careful consideration, the team determined that our elementary children will not be having kids camp in person at Bonita Park this summer. Instead, we will be offering virtual camp material via pre-recorded video lessons for each church to utilize at their convenience at their individual facilities. Each church can use this material as they see fit such as for a daycamp, a VBS opportunity, or even several weeks of Wednesday night activities. We understand that this is disappointing, as it is disappointing to us, but it is the best option at this time for the elementary school age children. More information will be on the NM district webpage soon. We are looking forward to this

year's virtual camp, and also to the possibility that God will use this new format to reach our children in a whole new way!

Children's Quizzing: Arthur Pacheco serves as our NM Quizzing Director. Arthur reports: This is my 6th report to you all as the District Children's Quizzing Director and it has definitely been an interesting year! I know everyone has had to cancel events and things did not take place this past year, but one thing that we did not cancel is studying the word of God and hiding it in our hearts! Quizzing is not about getting together and hanging out with our friends, it is about learning about the word of God, how to apply it to our lives and hide it in our hearts. Although it is nice to get together, we still accomplished our goal and mission for quizzing this year! Here are some numbers for you. We had a total of 54 children do quizzing this year. There were 7 churches who participated this year. We decreased in our numbers for various reasons, which was understandable for this year. Even though General Assembly was postponed for this year there will still be a World Quiz this year. The World Quiz will be held at the Regional level and we will all quiz the same day. Our World Quiz date is June 26, 2021 and it will be held at PLNU in San Diego, CA. At our District Meet, we had 29 children qualify for World Quiz!! We are so proud of them! They have worked hard this year to accomplish their goal! There will be an update on our results in The Mission, once the event happens.

A big shout out to Delaina Van Soest from Carlsbad for taking charge of Zone 2 quizzing! Sadly, she has decided to step down from her position and we will miss her in our quizzing community! We will need a new Zone 2 coordinator so if you are interested, let me know! I look forward to learning about Joshua, Judges and Ruth for next quiz year! Who knows what next year will look like, but I know the kids will be ready!

Statistics Reporting: Historically each district and each church had been asked to report three numbers monthly: 1) SDMI Attendance 2) Morning Worship Attendance and 3) Responsibility List. Statistics gathering was discontinued in 2020 so districts are no longer being requested to provide statistics to the Global Ministry Center. That said, Dr. Lacher is considering resuming collection of some statistics as it adds value to the district.

In 2022 we will hopefully be able to resume a more normal schedule of district events. We also look forward with anticipation for General Assembly and SDMI General Convention which has been moved to 2023.

The June 2021 SDMI Contention will complete my 6th year as SDMI Chairman (elected in June 2015 DA). It has been a great privilege and honor to serve as the chairman of

the New Mexico SDMI these past 6 years. As best I can recall, I started as Adult Ministries Director in 2012 and served in that role for 3 years, thus I served on the NM SDMI team for about 9 years. This will be my last report as SDMI Chairman as I have notified Dr. Lacher that I will not be running for another term as SDMI Chairman.

Thank you to the many dedicated people on our district who work diligently in service to our Lord.

Another common report from our churches around the district is the support and funds you have all poured into other local ministries and into our global church family. We all had to engage the mission creatively this past year. Many of you began to support local ministries in your communities if your churches were not already set up to meet various needs. Thousands of dollars were poured into your communities because you wanted to help people. Greetings from Bonita Park! What a joy it is to serve the New Mexico District through the ministry of Bonita Park!

As we report this year, we are coming to what we hope and pray is the end of a worldwide pandemic. We reported to you last year that by the time District Assembly convened, we had documented more than \$566,000 in canceled contracts. As we moved forward through 2020-2021, we faced more than \$1 million in group cancellations. We are still seeing some groups cancel due to mask mandates, international border travel restrictions and the uncertainty of planning ahead. We are praying that God will give group leaders peace through these ever-changing days.

How does one go from the loud, crazy, wonderful sounds of camp to complete silence in a day? How does that even happen?!? When the silence of the pandemic was crushing, and it was, we remembered that God is always in control and that He was not surprised by this virus sweeping the planet. We began to look at this unprecedented year as a gift. It almost began to feel like a Sabbath year. While Bonita Park is not used to being closed, we realized that if we were to move forward, we must lean into God's perfect timing and see all that He could accomplish through us without any guests on the grounds. With our mission "to fully utilize the resources God has granted us, inspiring each individual to leave Bonita Park more Christ-like, ready to make a difference in their own life, home and community," we soon realized that we could begin by making a difference in the lives of our staff, the camp residents, our community and our buildings. With very few guests leaving the grounds and going back to their communities, we started to pour into those around us. We came alongside each other and worked and trained and cried and prayed. As careful as we were, some of our staff contracted COVID19. Those were difficult days of quarantine. From the beginning of closing down, we were blessed beyond measure by monetary gifts from people who gave to "keep the lights on" and pay the staff. The secular noise of the pandemic didn't stop God's people from keeping the mission alive. Individuals gave. Churches gave. Guest groups gave. Bonita Park was the recipient of two Payroll Protection Program loans (one of those is forgiven) and one CARES Relief grant. We used restricted donor gifts to complete a remodeling project of the Morris Center kitchen and are beginning an exterior remodeling project at Armstrong Tabernacle. We have also planted more trees and improved facilities. We think you will notice the difference next time you are on the grounds.

Beyond all of the sounds of the pandemic, God has changed hearts at Bonita Park as a few groups came and went when the state health orders allowed. Compared to 2019's 9684 guests, this past fiscal year, we hosted 1948 guests. Each individual was a gift from God. As we handed them their "to go" meals because indoor dining wasn't allowed, or as we sent them down the zip line, we were told over and over how desperately their time at the camp was needed. We are anticipating a great year and trust that God will work in the lives of those coming to the camp as He has for more than 80 years. We continue to confide that God is raising up a mighty generation of people who are invested in Christian camping and believe that the work God can do in hearts and souls at camp is unlike the work accomplished anywhere else on the planet! It is life changing...to the core!! We believe that God is whispering into our hearts to get back to the plan of reclaiming the mountain. We believe He is telling us that His children are coming back to camp...be ready!

We are ready and we are always grateful for the gift of serving you and serving with you at your New Mexico District camp, Bonita Park!

C. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES

1. Finance Committee

We, Dr. Lawrence Lacher, District Superintendent, Larry Fry, District Treasurer, Ken Weisheit, District Secretary, Sharla Parker, Jordin West, Bruce Haley, Bill Belgie, Rick Hutchison, Gregory Van Soest, Nicole Young, Mark Asplund, Wade Elftman, Kent Carruthers, Patti Rivas, Christa Storch, Nate Bienhoff, and Randy Elftman, your District Finance Committee, believe responsible Christian stewardship involves each local church investing a portion of its income to the support and expansion of the mission and message of the worldwide Church of the Nazarene. A concern for others beyond our own influence declares a love and loyalty to the mission and message of God's kingdom here on earth. Every local church should carefully plan to meet this scriptural responsibility to God and His church reaching the lost by the full payment of apportionments. The love of Christ compels each local church to allow no unwarranted failure in this vital area of stewardship. Similarly, the District is committed to budgeting only on anticipated receipts, and to maintaining a balanced budget in all funds.

Items Related to Local Churches

We recommend that each local church board give prayerful consideration to its financial leadership responsibilities by:

1. Establishing annually an operating budget, approved by the church board and available to the congregation, for the ministries of the local church. This budget should be established based on a reasonable estimate of the giving income of each church and expenses

should be kept within the ability of the church to cover those expenses without external assistance. A copy should be sent to the district office if requested.

2. Giving positive leadership to the support of the Great Commission by faithful and regular payment of the World Evangelism Fund, Education Fund, Pensions and Benefits Fund and District Ministries Funds.

3. Supporting annually Nazarene Bible College (October) and Nazarene Theological Seminary (January) through receiving an offering and/or budgeting an appropriate amount in the annual operating budget. Each offering is to be sent directly to Nazarene Bible College, 17001 Prairie Star Parkway, Suite 300, Lenexa, KS 66220 or Nazarene Theological Seminary, 1700 East Meyer Blvd., Kansas City, MO 64131. The goal is 100 percent participation by every New Mexico District church in supporting our institutions of ministerial training and development.

4. Caring for the needs of the pastor and full-time ministerial staff, releasing them for their task of leadership in prayer and ministry of the Word, by:

- a. Paying the pastor and staff adequate salaries and benefits and reviewing them at least annually as part of establishing the coming year's operational budget. An increase of at least the cost of living should be considered as a minimum, taking into consideration any changes in law impacting Health Care coverage for your pastor and staff. The church board secretary should send a report of any salary action taken to the District Office.

- b. Designating an amount in the proposed operating budget for the coming year to pay the expenses of the pastor and spouse attending the General Assembly, General Conference on Evangelism, PALCON, District Assembly, Camp Meeting, District Leadership Retreat, and continuing education seminars, and other events where attendance is expected. To assist in budgeting this expense, the church should set aside \$500 or more annually. We encourage local churches to send full-time staff to appropriate conferences and seminars in consultation with the senior pastor.
- c. Establishing an accountable reimbursement plan for the pastors' ministry-related expenses. This would include professional journals and books, entertainment, travel and lodging and other related items as allowed by tax law. All ministry expenses are to be fully reimbursed when properly authorized and receipted according to IRS guidelines.
- d. Designating a certain amount of the pastors' total compensation package(s) as parsonage furnishing and housing allowance.
- e. Reimbursing the pastors an amount equal to the required SECA (Social Security) tax. This tax is assessed at 15.3 percent of the pastor's salary and housing allowance/ fair market rental value of the parsonage and should be paid at least quarterly. This amount must be added to their IRS form W-2 as income. This pro rata share should be paid to any pastor changing assignments during the calendar year.

- f. Each church should consider paying the annual premium on term life and accident insurance available through the Church of the Nazarene. Each church should also consider providing disability insurance for their pastors and insurance on contents of the parsonage as well.
- g. Participating in the Church of the Nazarene's Tax-Deferred Annuity Program for its ministers is highly recommended. Every church should enroll their pastor in the tax-deferred annuity program and at least match the general church contribution annually.
- h. Granting pastors and all full-time ministerial staff members a minimum of two weeks paid vacation annually. Those who have accumulated from five to ten years of salaried ministry in the Church of the Nazarene should be granted three weeks paid vacation; those who have served 11 to 19 years, four weeks of paid vacation; and those who have served the denomination 20 years or more, five weeks of paid vacation. This vacation time should be exclusive of time spent at district and general church meetings. Pastors are advised to use discretion and wisdom in the planning of their vacation in order to best work with the church calendar.
- i. Insisting that pastors observe at least one full work day as a weekly day off from all ministerial responsibilities and quarterly, a three day break from ministerial duties.
- j. Observing Manual paragraph 129.10, which states, "In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church

board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seven consecutive year of service in one congregation.” We recommend a minimum of sixty days paid sabbatical leave.

- k. Encouraging the morale of the pastor/staff and augmenting the salary of each by facilitating acts of kindness from the congregation, such as food donations and observing pastor’s appreciation day on the second Sunday of October.
- l. The local church give at least one week’s salary to the pastor and full-time associates at Christmas each year.

5. An auditing committee be appointed in each local church in accordance with Manual paragraph 129.23.

6. All fund allocations be paid in full annually and payments be made weekly or monthly throughout the church year; payments to begin on May 1, 2021, with the final payment to be made no later than May 15, 2022.

7. The district journal shall be provided to each church in PDF (electronic) form. Local churches may distribute PDF files and/or print as many copies as needed. **(District Journals, Manuals and Other Forms are currently made available at <http://nazarene.org/DocumentLibrary> Please contact the District Secretary or District Office if you have difficulty obtaining them)**

8. Our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to planned giving, wills, annuities, and life loans on behalf of the local church, district camps, home

missions, world missions, and colleges. Each pastor should give careful attention to conduct an active bequest program through the local church; for information write to Dr. Steve Seelig in care of Point Loma Nazarene University or Jon Twitchell at the Church of the Nazarene Foundation.

9. We recommend that the local church give careful consideration to paying evangelists, as a minimum, twice the weekly salary and benefits of the pastor, plus travel expenses one way and to remember those who served them during the year with a Christmas check of appreciation.

Guidelines for Local Church Treasurers

The responsibilities of the local church treasurer include:

1. Preparing, in cooperation with the pastor and church board, an annual operating budget for the local church.
2. Following the provisions of the 2017-2021 Manual paragraphs 129.21-129.23 in accounting for all money received and disbursed by the local church.
3. Providing all financial records and books to the pastor immediately upon request.
4. Preparing a weekly report of all money received and a monthly report of all financial transactions to the pastor and church board.

5. Promptly distributing all payments according to the time and purpose designated by the order of the church board. All fund allocations are to be paid in full annually and payments be made weekly or monthly throughout the church year.

6. Serving willingly as the local church treasurer according to Manual paragraph 136.

7. Ensuring designated funds are protected for that purpose.

8. Making sure the church board arrange for an annual auditing of all treasurers' books, according to Manual paragraph 129.23. An annual cash flow audit is expected, as is a full outside audit at least every five years by personnel outside the local church.

9. Certifying that all money received by the church or auxiliaries is properly recorded and reported. It is neither proper nor ethical to carry side accounts independent of the church treasurer's records.

10. Following the policy of never handling the physical offerings or money of the church but work from the deposit receipt prepared by competent personnel who have counted the offerings and deposited the money in the bank.

11. Submitting monthly reports to the district office, either using the "Funding the Mission" website (<https://fundingthemission.org/>) or using the spreadsheet provided by the District Treasurer. This regular reporting enables the District Treasurer to prepare for adjustments in district income and make decisions appropriately.

Items Related to District Interests

The District Finance Committee recommends that all district ministries and extensions should be considered a vital part of the local church outreach and fulfillment of the Great Commission in the following manner:

1. That those who travel for the district will be reimbursed at a rate of 50 cents per mile one way. This includes the District Advisory Board, District Board of Church Properties, Bonita Park Camp Board, District Board of Ministry, NMI, NYI, and SDMI councils, and all other committees called by the District Superintendent.

2. That the district treasurer pay the hospitalization insurance premium for the district superintendent and family.

3. That the district treasurer pay the annual premium on the maximum term life, accidental death and dismemberment, and long-term disability insurance provided through the Church of the Nazarene for the district superintendent.

4. That the district furnish the district superintendent a car replacement allowance and any operation and maintenance expense as determined by the District Advisory Board.

5. That the district superintendent annually be granted a five-week vacation with pay. A report of vacation days used should be presented to the DAB on a quarterly basis.

6. That all district financial records, including those of Bonita Park and the Extension Fund, be audited annually by an auditing firm or certified public accountant.

7. That all designated funds be kept in an interest bearing account or District Advisory Board approved investments.

8. That the District Superintendent be granted two weeks annually to hold meetings off the District. This will be in addition to his/her vacation time. Use of this provision should be reported to the DAB.

Items Related to Fund Apportionments

1. That the Annual Pastor’s Report (APR), submitted online, shall be the guide for computing all budgets. Funding the Mission allocations goals are 5.5% for the World Evangelism Fund (WEF), 2.25% for Pensions and Benefits USA (P&B), 2.25% for Education, 6.0% for District Budget, of the local church’s Total Income (line 30) less amounts given for WEF (line 31) and Mission Specials (line 32). Churches will be considered in full support if these goals are met in full.

WEF and P&B funds should be submitted at least monthly using the “Funding the Mission” (FTM) website (<https://fundingthemission.org/>) where possible. All other fund allocations are to be sent monthly to the District Treasurer, Larry Fry, 3101 Mesa Verde Street, Roswell, NM 88201 (E-mail: l.fry@msn.com (575-914-3050))

2. That a unified District Budget will be distributed according to the following formula:

2. Education Committee

Your Committee on Education makes the following commendations and recommendations:

1. In recognition of the vital role that formal Christian higher education plays in our society, we encourage our churches to give prayer and financial support to Point Loma Nazarene University (PLNU), Nazarene Bible College (NBC) and Nazarene Theological Seminary (NTS) through full payment of educational budgets, support of annual offerings, encouraging students within the local church to attend these institutions, and through recommending that they be included when planning wills, gifts and bequests. **(Estate planning is available through the office of PLNU's Institutional Advancement.)**
2. We call on all of our educational institutions (local, regional and genera) to reflect the theological heritage, moral and social commitments, and core values of the Church of the Nazarene in teaching, doctrine, and values, and in responding to our changing cultural climate. We expect that faculty and staff will be supportive of and in alignment with the doctrines and values of the International Church of the Nazarene.
3. We encourage participation in campus events at PLNU for high school age students, including Preview, Southwest Elev8, and other special events.
4. We encourage members of the local church to use the PLNU Vacation by the Sea opportunity during the summer.
5. We encourage local churches to participate in the ministry of PLNU periodically by inviting the university personnel, including special speakers, musical groups, and students, to participate in our local church services and we understand the expenses related to this participation need to be the responsibility of the local church.

6. We encourage participation in alumni and auxiliary activities of PLNU, NBC, and NTS.
7. We encourage new pastors who have transferred from other educational regions to visit the PLNU campus as soon as possible after arriving on the region by taking advantage of President Brower's invitation for the complimentary use of college facilities.
8. We encourage each local church to participate in the PLNU matching grant program. If a local church will send any amount up to \$250 per year to PLNU on behalf of students from that church, PLNU will match that gift up to an additional \$250 per year (or \$125 per semester). Additionally, the college will award a \$2700 grant to students from the New Mexico District. However, these dollars are only awarded for students whose churches send in a matching grant contribution.
