



Sunberg Presides Over 109th Assembly



Dr. Carla Sunberg was elected 43rd general superintendent of the Church of the Nazarene at the 29th General Assembly in Indianapolis, Indiana, in June 2017. At the time of her election, Dr. Sunberg was president of Nazarene Theological Seminary, where she had been serving since January 2014.

She was ordained on the Russia North District, where she and her husband, Chuck, served the Church of the Nazarene for 13 years as pioneer missionaries to the former Soviet Union. While in Moscow, Russia, she served as director of Compassionate Ministries and later as director of theological education for the field. In 2005, the Sunbergs returned to the United States and began pastoring at Grace Point Church of the Nazarene in Fort Wayne, Indiana. In 2011, she and her husband accepted a call to serve as co-district superintendents of the East Ohio District Church of the Nazarene.

Sunberg has a bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) degree from MidAmerica Nazarene University, a master of Arts in Theological Studies (MATS) degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary (NTS), and a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Historical Theology from Nazarene Theological College and the University of Manchester, United Kingdom. In May 2012, she was awarded an honorary Doctor of Divinity (DD) degree from Olivet Nazarene University.

Dr. Sunberg has a long record of service to the Church of the Nazarene. She has served on the General Board; on the Board of Trustees for NTS and Mount Vernon Nazarene University; as member and chairperson of the USA/Canada Region's Nazarene Women Clergy Council; and as member of the board of the Church of the Nazarene's Pensions & Benefits USA. In addition, after serving on its board as the official representative for the Church of the Nazarene, Sunberg also served as president of Wesleyan-Holiness Women Clergy.

Sunberg is co-author with Gene Van Note of *Faxes from Russia* (Beacon Hill Press, 1996), as well as author of numerous articles for various church publications. She has also written *Reclaiming Eve: The Identity and Calling of Women in the Kingdom of God* (Beacon Hill Press, 2014) with co-authors Suzanne Burden and Jamie Wright, *Reflecting the Image: Our Call to Mirror Christ in the World* (Beacon Hill Press, 2015) written with Keri Mitchell, and *The Cappadocian Mothers: Deification Exemplified in the Writings of Basil, Gregory and Gregory* (Wipf Stock, 2017).

Carla was born in Germany, the daughter of missionaries. She loves to teach and train leaders for the future of the church and has served as adjunct faculty for a number of institutions. Her heartfelt passion is a life of holiness and service for the Lord. Carla and Chuck are proud parents of two adult daughters, Christa, who along with her husband, Iain Maciver, lives in England; and Cara, who with her husband, Justin Shonamon, and daughters Mackenzie and Alice, lives in Shawnee, Kansas.



STATISTICAL GROWTH CHART



DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Larry Lacher, District Superintendent

What Difference Are You Making?

It has been my honor to serve as superintendent of the New Mexico District for my third year and to receive a strong endorsement from the district assembly extending my service for four years. I am truly humbled and grateful to be able to serve God and the church in this way and thankful to you for your trust and partnership as we work together to make this district a stronger and more vibrant district together.

I want to welcome you all to our 109th District Assembly for the New Mexico District and express my appreciation to Heights First Church, Pastor Tim Tharp and his amazing team for their outstanding hosting of our Conventions and Assembly. As always, they have demonstrated excellence in all they have done. I also want to welcome Dr. Carla Sunberg to New Mexico and thank her for her friendship and coaching throughout the year. I also want to welcome our other special guests, Dr. Ron Benefiel of Point Loma, Dr. Scott Sherwood of NBC, Rev. Jon Twitchell of the Nazarene Foundation, and, most especially, all of you New Mexico District Nazarenes, both here in the room and those attending remotely.

I want to begin my report by thanking you for granting me a lengthy sabbatical leave this year, which gave me both time to rest and time to survey the land that God has given to us in the New Mexico District, focusing on El Paso and the part of Texas that is part of our district, the Southeast corner of New Mexico and the Northeast corner of New Mexico. During this season, the Lord seemed to speak to me three words of scripture:

Deuteronomy 1:8, See I have set the land before you. Enter and take possession of the land the LORD swore to give to your fathers Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Chapman, Cagle, and Davis [our first three DSs) and their future descendants.

Deuteronomy 1:21, See, the LORD your God has set the land before you. Go up and take possession of it as the LORD, the God of your fathers, has told you. Do not be afraid or discouraged.

Joshua 18:3, So Joshua asked the Israelites, "How long will you delay going out to take possession of the land the LORD, the God of your fathers, gave you?"

In my survey of the land during my sabbatical, I saw that we could put a "pin on the map" for at least 67 new churches in New Mexico and South Texas. I will tell you at this point that I have not let that dream go back to sleep. I am continually working to find resources, use the resources we have, train the people we have, and keep the dream constantly alive and active in every way. Some of those ways include:

- Our Trinity Church has offered to reinvest its building back into the district to be sold to support the starting of new works in and around El Paso. These proceeds will be the beginning of the Texas Fund which will be about \$500,000, and will be strategically allocated to help us to expand the work that God is helping us to reimagine in the El Paso and Borderland area. God is drawing workers to this harvest field who see the harvest and have a burden for this fastest-growing part of our district. I believe that it will not be long before El Paso becomes an anchor of mission for our district again as it has historically been, thanks to the vision and sacrifice of people who are able to see the great harvest that is there.
- We are also working with Global Missions resources to help train and plant churches in El Paso and into Texas. As collaborative effort is being established to create a training school in the Wenda House and <u>TABLE OF CONTENTS</u> 17 <u>District Reports</u>

Roberto and Rhesa have offered to help in any way they can with the blessing of the Global Ministry Center. Other resources have been promised to support the vision.

- With Texas in mind, perhaps it is time to consider renaming of the district to include our Texas responsibility. I have been toying with a couple of thoughts.
- The Wenda House with Imagine is preparing to become a host center for short term mission teams from several of our Nazarene Universities. We are considering how to leverage these opportunities to strengthen our efforts to plant and to grow churches in the greater El Paso area and in the New Mexico District.
- Rev. Angela Walker has joined our team in El Paso and will work with Chuck and the district on Immigrant issues, becoming a resource for us in that area.
- Not to neglect the rest of the district, we will be more intentionally using Pete Myers out of Albuquerque in providing regular assessment and training of church planters.
- We had several couples attend an Assessment Center in Arizona in May so that they could be prepared as future church planters.
- Pete and I are working on plans to create a regular rotation of church planting training on the district as we become more intentional about planting churches across the district.
- With the Board of Ministry, I am still working to make the process of ministerial preparation on the district more complete and robust so that we can raise up leaders to be equipped to help bring in the harvest.
- Our division into new Mission Areas last year is beginning to bear fruit, notably among the Hispanic Mission Area and the Sacramento Mountain Mission Area. You will hear reports today of how our Mission Areas are beginning to partner together to think beyond the border of their local churches and to begin dreaming of missional engagement throughout their sector of the land which God has granted to them.
- Ultimately, the most successful church planting model is churches-planting-churches. Therefore, it is the district's responsibility to cast vision for church planting and to come along side churches that are catching that vision with resources and support where we can.

Last year, by God's grace, we were able to report that the financial negative balance of the district had been erased. I cannot tell you what a miracle that was. It seems that across the district, this year has been the Covid slump in income. Most of the churches are "tight" financially, since they are not getting any backstop money like they did last year. Still our churches have been faithful in giving to their budgets, for which I am so grateful and our Finance Committee continues to hold the line on expenses, so that there were no projected increases in the district expenses this year. I deeply appreciate the sacrifices that churches and pastors make in order to be faithful to their broader commitments to the district and global church and certainly pledge to be prudent and frugal in the use of the funds entrusted to the district to be invested carefully for missional purposes. On the good side, many of our churches with schools and/or daycares received significant government checks this year and have put that money to good use for salaries or facility improvements. The

highest one I have heard of was over \$900,000. In the end, we received almost exactly what we had budgeted to receive in district income this year thanks to the faithfulness of our churches across the district.

So, Let's Get a Picture of the Numbers and Celebrate:

First of all, I am overwhelmed that virtually every one of our churches paid all of their budgets in full during this very difficult year.

Now, before we list individual churches, I want to show you something that I think is absolutely remarkable... As a district, we have paid over 100% in every category of our mission to others – in a year that has been difficult for every local church. I'm sure Dr. Sunberg can correct me, but I can tell you that I have never been on a district in my forty years of ministry where it has been the case that the district has been over 100% in all areas of ministry to others. I am so stinking proud of you. I want you to congratulate yourselves!

I also want to thank and congratulate individually those that paid all their ministry to others budgets in full by providing a certificate of appreciation and a little treat for the pastor – coffee! The pages will deliver these to you later. As I read your name, would your delegation stand and remain standing until I finish the list, then we will celebrate together.

I am proud of these churches and thank their monumental efforts in a very hard year.

Dollars help support the mission, but the mission is to make Christlike disciples in the Nations. So, the numbers that truly matter are these. Our district reported a total of 247 people brought to Christ this year, 95 baptisms and 127 New Nazarenes! Thirty of our churches reported seeing at least one person coming to Jesus this year. Leading that list was:

- 1. Farmington Crossroads Community with 48
- 2. Albuquerque Pajarito Mesa with 40
- 3. Clovis Living Stones with 24
- 4. Aztec with 17
- 5. Albuquerque Sandia Central, Sandia Valley, and Revival and Compassion Ministries, each with 10.

As you know, I have focused my "rebuilding" of the district around "Four Pillars of Awakening:" *Intentional (corporate) Prayer; Passionate Throne-ward Worship; Deliberate Discipleship; and Intentional Engagement with the Broken in Your Community.* I am delighted to see many of our churches taking intentional steps to improve their ministries in these areas and I could highlight a number of specific churches that are doing remarkable things in each of these areas. Rather than taking up space to talk about individual churches, I'd like to mention three ways that we are intentionally keeping these themes in front of our churches.

- 1. I have determined to use my Leadership Retreats specifically to provide teaching and practice in these themes. This past Fall, we invited the Jones Gang (Corey, Beth Ann, Chad, and Marti) to teach and model Throne-ward worship. It was a wonderful retreat in which God moved in and provided both great teaching and modeling as well as renewing and healing for weary pastors.
- 2. This Fall, Dr. Carla Sunberg will be our speaker to talk about how making missional connections creates gospel opportunities (*Intentional Engagement with the Broken in Your Community*).
- 3. About five of our churches got involved in a pilot project that we have been working on in cooperation with Point Loma on Virtue Formation. We have been developing a process of "discipleship" designed around a Wesley approach to virtue formation that is informed by psychology and behavior science. The question is, "How do we help people not just to know better, but to do better." We are hoping that this process will become the gold standard in spiritual formation for our district.
- 4. Jan Sweeney continues to train and to lead churches in the "Discipled by Jesus" model of discipleship, teaching people to live as active listeners to the voice of Jesus and to walk in intentional obedience to that voice.

Three years in and I am still finding this job to be "an adventure a minute." On average I drive about 36,000 miles a year on the district. I sleep in my own bed, on average, two or three nights a week. I make every effort to be in a different church each weekend and to spend time with all the pastors I can when I am in an area. I have had face time with nearly every pastor on the district at one time or another, or have, at least spent time on the phone with them. I am teaching three to four classes per year for NBC or other schools and teach Leadership Zoom Monday AM/PM for any district pastor who cares to join. I find these opportunities to speak into the lives of others both life-giving and fulfilling in many ways. Living on the grounds of Bonita Park afford me many opportunities to interface with the leadership of the camp to share thoughts and ideas, or, even, to serve a meal or two to guests. I have also continued to serve as a Trustee to Point Loma Nazarene University as a member of the Academic Affairs Committee.

Yet, we have yet to have a "normal" year since I have been in this job. We have been managing Covid almost the entire time I have been in this office and will now begin to figure out where we are in a post-pandemic world and how we move forward.

Highlights

There have been many highlights throughout the past year that I could talk about across the district. I have been particularly impressed by the way that churches have rallied to support one another as we have had some pastors experience some very difficult health and family issues this year. I have seen a number of churches reach out to provide support to one another and fill in where there were gaps. If I started to mention all of those places, I'd have to add several pages. Let me list just a few major highlights from this year:

- I was proud to be part of the ecumenical MLK service in Ruidoso where our own Earseye Ross shared his experience as one who marched with Dr. King in a riveting hour of insight, humor, and inspiration.
- I was proud to see so many of our churches rally to support Mountainair in rebuilding their parsonage, sending money and people to accomplish what would have been impossible for that congregation, so they could bring in a new pastor and begin a new day.
- I have been proud to watch all the work go on at Bonita Park as they have used the Covid pause to rebuild and renew the grounds and facilities in many ways seen and unseen.
- I have been proud to see a number of our churches discover new and creative ways of reaching beyond their doors to touch their neighbors with the love of Christ unlike they never have before while others are seriously seeking new pathways of ministries that they have never considered before, understanding that things must change if they are going to have an impactful future in ministry.
- I am thrilled that Imagine Church in El Paso has finally had a first service (April 2) with forty in attendance as the fruit of two years of planting seeds of love and earning trust in that community.
- I am proud of the work that Tammie continues to do to grow 26:16 in Farmington and the growing synergy the churches of San Juan County are learning.
- I continue to be amazed by the work that Chris Davis does among the Native Americans in Gallup and Grants and by the work that Erika and Ruth do in Bernalillo, and by the work that is being done at the Valley Campus in Albuquerque, and in so many other places where Nazarenes are committed to reaching the least, the last, and the lost with the love of Jesus.

Here's the Question, then, that I want to leave lingering as I bring this report to a close: What difference are YOU making?

Imagine if you will that your church was suddenly wiped off the face of the city where God has planted you. Imagine it simply disappeared, via wildfire or some other random occurrence. Besides the people who attend your services being displaced, would there be any other impact noticed in your neighborhood? Would anyone be left wanting for ministry? Would anyone be left without the touch of the love of Jesus? Would anyone have no one else to turn to because your church was suddenly not there to stand in the gap and make up the hedge? What is the one thing that you are doing that is making a difference in the lives of the people that God is trying to reach in your community? If you can identify that one thing, you may know something about the mission God has for you? If you cannot, you may need to ask God, "What do You have for my hands?" Here's what has changed in the business of being church. People aren't looking for church. They are looking for mission. People will join your mission before they join your Jesus and people will join your Jesus before they join your church. Welcome people to the mission and introduce them to Jesus, then they will see the value of the church again.

MISSION AREA PASTOR MINISTRY DESCRIPTION

The Mission Area Pastor will work with the district superintendent in order to increase connectedness among pastors and churches across the district, enhance missional vision and impact, and heighten cooperation between churches and the district in accomplishing mission within the New Mexico District. There will be no direct compensation for this role, but there may be some expense reimbursement for assigned responsibilities at the discretion of the district office/superintendent. The mission area pastor's responsibilities will/may include the following:

- Maintain a network of support for all pastors, spouses, associates, chaplains, retired pastors, and any other ministers and spouses within the mission area in which, at least monthly, contact is made for prayer, conversation, support, and engagement.
- Provide a means for welcoming new ministers into the mission area or for sending off ministers who move or pass on to heaven.
- Ensure that the district office is informed of special circumstances that may require attention from the superintendent or other district or general officer.
- Provide for special circumstances or needs among ministers as needed.
- Arrange for semi-annual or annual gatherings to discuss and strategize about mission expansion in the area (the district superintendent should be informed and invited to these meetings).
- Arrange for times of fellowship among pastors and/or churches within the area on an occasional basis.
- Serve, when asked, as the representative of the district superintendent for pastoral interviews or other board meetings.
- Give oversight to Church type missions within their mission area in the following ways:
 - Leadership development
 - Financial accountability (reviewing quarterly financial reports)
 - Denominational connectedness (budget payments and missional alignment)
 - Mentoring, encouragement, and support
 - Quarterly written reporting to the District Superintendent

- h. We recommend the District Assembly adopt the following Fellowship Membership Policy in accordance with manual Paragraph 108 Fellowship Members: Those who have completed the membership process but conditions are not appropriate for full membership, however they still wish to be united with church in some fashion. Fellowship members agree to pursue spiritual growth, regular church attendance, financial support, and participation in the ministries of the local church. Fellowship member will be prohibited from voting and leadership. Fellowship members can become full members at any time when prohibiting conditions are resolved with the approval of the pastor and the church membership committee. The church shall maintain a record of fellowship members in the church files.
- i. We have advised the District Superintendent on the supervision of all the departments, boards and committees of the district and have consulted with him on the development of the local churches, new church starts, and the care of all district resources, including Bonita Park Camp and Conference Center. All minutes of the board have been kept and recorded by the board secretary and are on file in the NM District Office.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Larry G. Fry, Chairman

We, Dr. Lawrence Lacher, District Superintendent, Larry Fry, District Treasurer, Ken Weisheit, District Secretary, Jordin West, Bruce Haley, Rick Hutchison, Christa Storch, Nicole Young, Mark Asplund, Wade Elftman, John Graham, Ryan Nelson, and Randy Elftman, your District Finance Committee, believe responsible Christian stewardship involves each local church investing a portion of its income to the support and expansion of the mission and message of the worldwide Church of the Nazarene. A concern for others beyond our own influence declares a love and loyalty to the mission and message of God's kingdom here on earth. Every local church should carefully plan to meet this scriptural responsibility to God and His church reaching the lost by the full payment of apportionments. The love of Christ compels each local church to allow no unwarranted failure in this vital area of stewardship. Similarly, the District is committed to budgeting only on anticipated receipts, and to maintaining a balanced budget in all funds.

Items Related to Local Churches

We recommend that each local church board give prayerful consideration to its financial leadership responsibilities by:

- 1. Establishing annually an operating budget, approved by the church board and available to the congregation, for the ministries of the local church. This budget should be established based on a reasonable estimate of the giving income of each church and expenses should be kept within the ability of the church to cover those expenses without external assistance. A copy should be sent to the district office if requested.
- 2. Giving positive leadership to the support of the Great Commission by faithful and regular payment of the World Evangelism Fund, Education Fund, Pensions and Benefits Fund and District Ministries Funds.
- 3. Supporting annually Nazarene Bible College (October) and Nazarene Theological Seminary (January) through receiving an offering and/or budgeting an appropriate amount in the annual operating budget. Each offering is to be sent directly to Nazarene Bible College, 17001 Prairie Star Parkway, Suite 300, Lenexa, KS 66220 or Nazarene Theological Seminary, 1700 East Meyer Blvd., Kansas City, MO 64131. The goal is 100 percent participation by every New Mexico District church in supporting our institutions of ministerial training and development.
- 4. Caring for the needs of the pastor and full-time ministerial staff, releasing them for their task of leadership in prayer and ministry of the Word, by:
 - a. Paying the pastor and staff adequate salaries and benefits and reviewing them at least annually as part of establishing the coming year's operational budget. An increase of at least the cost of living should be considered as a minimum, taking into consideration any changes in law impacting Health Care coverage for your pastor and staff. The church board secretary should send a report of any salary action taken to the District Office.
 - b. Designating an amount in the proposed operating budget for the coming year to pay the expenses of the pastor and spouse attending the General Assembly, General Conference on Evangelism, PALCON, District Assembly, Camp Meeting, District Leadership Retreat, and continuing education seminars, and other events where attendance is expected. To assist in budgeting this expense, the church should set aside \$500 or more annually. We encourage local churches to send full-time staff to appropriate conferences and seminars in consultation with the senior pastor.

- c. Establishing an accountable reimbursement plan for the pastors' ministry-related expenses. This would include professional journals and books, entertainment, travel and lodging and other related items as allowed by tax law. All ministry expenses are to be fully reimbursed when properly authorized and receipted according to IRS guidelines.
- d. Designating a certain amount of the pastors' total compensation package(s) as parsonage furnishing and housing allowance.
- e. Reimbursing the pastors an amount equal to the required SECA (Social Security) tax. This tax is assessed at 15.3 percent of the pastor's salary and housing allowance/ fair market rental value of the parsonage and should be paid at least quarterly. This amount must be added to their IRS form W-2 as income. This pro rata share should be paid to any pastor changing assignments during the calendar year.
- f. Each church should consider paying the annual premium on term life and accident insurance available through the Church of the Nazarene. Each church should also consider providing disability insurance for their pastors and insurance on contents of the parsonage as well.
- g. Participating in the Church of the Nazarene's Tax-Deferred Annuity Program for its ministers is highly recommended. Every church should enroll their pastor in the tax-deferred annuity program and at least match the general church contribution annually.
- h. Granting pastors and all full-time ministerial staff members a minimum of two weeks paid vacation annually. Those who have accumulated from five to ten years of salaried ministry in the Church of the Nazarene should be granted three weeks paid vacation; those who have served 11 to 19 years, four weeks of paid vacation; and those who have served the denomination 20 years or more, five weeks of paid vacation. This vacation time should be exclusive of time spent at district and general church meetings. Pastors are advised to use discretion and wisdom in the planning of their vacation in order to best work with the church calendar.
- i. Insisting that pastors observe at least one full work day as a weekly day off from all ministerial responsibilities and quarterly, a three day break from ministerial duties.
- j. Observing Manual paragraph 129.10, which states, "In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seven consecutive year of service in one congregation." We recommend a minimum of sixty days paid sabbatical leave.
- k. Encouraging the morale of the pastor/staff and augmenting the salary of each by facilitating acts of kindness from the congregation, such as food donations and observing pastor's appreciation day on the second Sunday of October.
- 1. The local church give at least one week's salary to the pastor and full-time associates at Christmas each year.
- 5. An auditing committee be appointed in each local church in accordance with Manual paragraph 129.23.
- 6. All fund allocations be paid in full annually and payments be made weekly or monthly throughout the church year; payments to begin on May 1, 2022, with the final payment to be made no later than May 15, 2023.

- 7. The district journal shall be provided to each church in PDF (electronic) form. Local churches may distribute PDF files and/or print as many copies as needed. (District Journals, Manuals and Other Forms are currently made available at http://nazarene.org/DocumentLibrary. Please contact the District Secretary or District Office if you have difficulty obtaining them.)
- 8. Our people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to planned giving, wills, annuities, and life loans on behalf of the local church, district camps, home missions, world missions, and colleges. Each pastor should give careful attention to conduct an active bequest program through the local church; for information write to Dr. Steve Seelig in care of Point Loma Nazarene University or Jon Twitchell at the Church of the Nazarene Foundation.
- 9. We recommend that the local church give careful consideration to paying evangelists, as a minimum, twice the weekly salary and benefits of the pastor, plus travel expenses one way and to remember those who served them during the year with a Christmas check of appreciation.

Guidelines for Local Church Treasurers

The responsibilities of the local church treasurer include:

- 1. Preparing, in cooperation with the pastor and church board, an annual operating budget for the local church.
- 2. Following the provisions of the 2017-2021 Manual paragraphs 129.21-129.23 in accounting for all money received and disbursed by the local church.
- 3. Providing all financial records and books to the pastor immediately upon request.
- 4. Preparing a weekly report of all money received and a monthly report of all financial transactions to the pastor and church board.
- 5. Promptly distributing all payments according to the time and purpose designated by the order of the church board. All fund allocations are to be paid in full annually and payments be made weekly or monthly throughout the church year.
- 6. Serving willingly as the local church treasurer according to Manual paragraph 136.
- 7. Ensuring designated funds are protected for that purpose.
- 8. Making sure the church board arrange for an annual auditing of all treasurer's books, according to Manual paragraph 129.23. An annual cash flow audit is expected, as is a full outside audit at least every five years by personnel outside the local church.
- 9. Certifying that all money received by the church or auxiliaries is properly recorded and reported. It is neither proper nor ethical to carry side accounts independent of the church treasurer's records.
- 10. Following the policy of never handling the physical offerings or money of the church but work from the deposit receipt prepared by competent personnel who have counted the offerings and deposited the money in the bank.
- 11. Submitting monthly reports to the district office, either using the "Funding the Mission" website (https://fundingthemission.org/) or using the spreadsheet provided by the District Treasurer. This regular TABLE OF CONTENTS 35 **District Reports**

reporting enables the District Treasurer to prepare for adjustments in district income and make decisions appropriately.

Items Related to District Interests

The District Finance Committee recommends that all district ministries and its extensions should be considered a vital part of the local church outreach and fulfillment of the Great Commission in the following manner:

- 1. That those who travel for the district will be reimbursed at a rate of 50 cents per mile one way. This includes the District Advisory Board, District Board of Church Properties, Bonita Park Camp Board, District Board of Ministry, NMI, NYI, and NDI councils, and all other committees called by the district superintendent or Auxiliary chairs.
- 2. That the District Superintendent's total remuneration be determined by the District Advisory Board and reviewed annually. From this total remuneration, the Superintendent may at his or her discretion, in consultation with the district treasurer and the District Sub-Finance Committee divide the total into the following categories as he or she sees fit and as best benefits his/her tax status: Salary, Health Insurance, Life Insurance, Disability Insurance, AD&D Insurance, Dental Insurance, Social Security Insurance, State and Federal Withholding Taxes, Contribution to Nazarene Retirement Plan, Christmas Bonus, and Housing Allowance.
- 3. That the district furnish the district superintendent a car replacement allowance as set by the District Advisory Board and will pay fuel expense for miles driven on the district for district business.
- 4. The District Superintendent's spouse is considered to be a full partner in the superintendent's ministry and his/her expenses will be paid when accompanying the superintendent on district business. The cost of the superintendent's spouse's attendance at district retreats will be considered a district expense as well.
- 5. That the district superintendent annually be granted a five-week vacation with pay. A report of vacation days used should be presented to the DAB on a quarterly basis.
- 6. That all district financial records, including those of Bonita Park and the Extension Fund, be audited annually by an auditing firm or certified public accountant.
- 7. That all designated funds be kept in an interest-bearing account or District Advisory Board approved investments.
- 8. That the District Superintendent be granted two weeks annually to hold meetings off the District. This will be in addition to his/her vacation time. Use of this provision should be reported to the DAB.

Items Related to Fund Apportionments

 That the Annual Pastor's Report (APR), submitted online, shall be the guide for computing all budgets. Funding the Mission allocations goals are 5.5% for the World Evangelism Fund (WEF), 2.25% for Pensions and Benefits USA (P&B), 2.25% for Education, 6.0% for District Budget, of the local church's Total Income (line 30) less amounts given for WEF (line 31) and Mission Specials (line 32). Churches will be considered in full support if these goals are met in full. WEF and P&B funds should be submitted at least monthly using the "Funding the Mission" (FTM) website (<u>https://fundingthemission.org/</u>) where possible. All other fund allocations are to be sent monthly to the District Treasurer, Larry Fry, 3101 Mesa Verde Street, Roswell, NM 88201 (email: <u>l.fry@msn.com</u>; phone: 575-914-3050) 2. That a unified District Budget will be distributed according to the following formula:

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Your Committee on Education makes the following commendations and recommendations:

- 1. In recognition of the vital role that formal Christian higher education plays in our society, we encourage our churches to give prayer and financial support to Point Loma Nazarene University (PLNU), Nazarene Bible College (NBC) and Nazarene Theological Seminary (NTS) through full payment of educational budgets, support of annual offerings, encouraging students within the local church to attend these institutions, and through recommending that they be included when planning wills, gifts and bequests. **(Estate planning is available through the office of PLNU's Institutional Advancement.)**
- 2. We call on all of our educational institutions (local, regional and general) to reflect the theological heritage, moral and social commitments, and core values of the Church of the Nazarene in teaching, doctrine, and values, and in responding to our changing cultural climate. We expect that faculty and staff will be supportive of and in alignment with the doctrines and values of the International Church of the Nazarene.
- 3. We encourage participation in campus events at PLNU for high school age students, including Preview, Southwest Elev8, and other special events.
- 4. We encourage members of the local church to use the PLNU Vacation by the Sea opportunity during the summer.
- 5. We encourage local churches to participate in the ministry of PLNU periodically by inviting the university personnel, including special speakers, musical groups, and students, to participate in our local church services and we understand the expenses related to this participation need to be the responsibility of the local church.
- 6. We encourage participation in alumni and auxiliary activities of PLNU, NBC, and NTS.
- 7. We encourage new pastors who have transferred from other educational regions to visit the PLNU campus as soon as possible after arriving on the region by taking advantage of President Brower's invitation for the complimentary use of college facilities.
- 8. We encourage each local church to participate in the PLNU matching grant program. If a local church will send any amount up to \$250 per year to PLNU on behalf of students from that church, PLNU will match that gift up to an additional \$250 per year (or \$125 per semester). Additionally, the college will award a \$2,700 grant to students from the New Mexico District. However, these dollars are only awarded for students whose churches send in a matching grant contribution.

All the Difference

One day a man was walking along the beach, when he noticed a boy hurriedly picking up and gently throwing things into the ocean. Approaching the boy, he asked, "Young man, what are you doing?" The boy replied, "Throwing starfish back into the ocean. The surf is up and the tide is going out. If I don't throw them back, they'll die." The man laughed to himself and said, "Don't you realize there are miles and miles of beach and hundreds of starfish? You can't make any difference!" After listening politely, the boy bent down, picked up another starfish, and threw it into the surf. Then, smiling at the man, he said, "I made a difference to that one."

This old parable paints a beautiful picture of what it is to be the church right now. Sometimes we can get overwhelmed and caught up looking at all that needs to be fixed in this world. We are inundated with disturbing headlines, heartbreaking realities, and insurmountable suffering in this world. The sheer magnitude of what it would take to correct all the wrongs in our broken world can overwhelm us to the point of inaction. But, God. He has invited us to partner with Him in His redemptive activity here on the earth. We get to open our hearts and lives and resources to the mission He has called us to by surrendering to His heart for His Creation. We reach out to help the one because it matters. It makes all the difference to someone deeply loved by their Creator.

As Nazarenes, our mission has always been found in the lost and hurting people who surround us wherever we are. Our first churches, as a denomination, were found in the poorest areas of cities. The mission was outside the front door, then, as it is today. The COVID pandemic has pushed our churches to see more clearly how God would have us move in the neighborhoods around us. 2020 was going to be the year of "clear vision," but it ended up completely knocking us off our routines and opened our eyes more to the needs directly in front of us. Our priorities shifted as we reprioritized how we do church, how we participate in mission, and how we approach our calling as Followers of Christ. All the Difference

As I have prayed about how to conclude my report this year, I was reminded of something God showed me many years ago. This story involves my sister and if you will bear with me, I hope you will find value in the lesson.

My sister is a missionary for a different organization. She has served on the field for the past fifteen years in some challenging places. We have spent the majority of our adult life raising our kids together, continents apart. Early in their career, while on a home assignment, I began to dread their return to the field. They lived in a difficult country on the other side of the world and the separation was incredibly hard. My flesh was crying out and miserable at the thought of them leaving again and I began to feel tempted to speak my desires over her. In the middle of my emotional struggle the Lord reminded me of His words to Peter when Peter began to rebuke him for speaking about his death. Matthew 16:23 says, "Jesus turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

My eyes were opened up to the power of my perspective and my words in that moment. I could allow the adversary to speak through me words that were rooted in selfishness and fear: my merely human concerns that would be a stumbling block to His mission and plan for her life. Or I could ask the Lord to speak through me as an encouragement and to give me insight into the concerns of God and His plan for my sister and her family. My mindset made all the difference to my outlook and actions.

The boy in the starfish story was not discouraged by the number of starfish stranded on the beach. He was also not discouraged by the questions of the visiting man. His thoughts were for the ones he could help and his mindset made all the difference.

We have this same choice every day. We can choose to stay concerned with only human concerns and allow fear, inconvenience, discouragement, and selfishness to keep us from engaging in the mission before us. Or we can ask for God to reveal His ways to us, to open our eyes to the things that concern Him and participate in His activity in the world. Our perspective of the opportunities before us are what make all the difference in the world around us. When our minds are filled with the things of God, we are open to the partnership He offers us to engage with people and His redemptive activity in the world. The thoughts that keep us from connecting with God's plan and His people are from the adversary and they are counterproductive to the things of God.

2 Corinthians 10:3-5 says "For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ."

Romans 12:2 says "Do not conform to the patterns of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – his good, pleasing and perfect will."

Our perspective makes all the difference. We need to know who we are allowing to influence our thought life and allow the Spirit to transform and renew our minds. When the adversary wants to send discouragement, detachment, and fear, we need to take those thoughts captive and set our minds on the things of God. When our minds are filled with the concerns of God, then we can be His people in the world around us. We can allow the concerns of God to transform how we engage in His mission. Then we will make all the difference.

Before we get into all the reports, I would like to take a moment and thank our New Mexico Nazarene Discipleship Council: Dr. Larry Lacher, Nicole Young, Jordin West, Larry Fry, Diana Bloomquist, Arthur Pacheco, Sherri Todd, Sharla Parker, Paula Vaughn, Wade Elftman, DeAnn Rushing, Christa Storch, and Ron Davis. This team has been incredible to work with. I greatly appreciate their leadership, their ideas, and their heart to serve!

If you have not heard, there has been a name change from SDMI (Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International) to NDI (Nazarene Discipleship International). There are a couple of things I want to share about this change. The first thing I want to share is that this name change aligns discipleship with the other auxiliaries of the Church of the Nazarene (NYI and NMI). Along with that, the mission of NDI is to carry out the Great Commission to children, youth, and adults in preparation for a lifelong journey of being and making Christlike disciples in the nations. The purpose of NDI is to assist local churches in: a. Reaching non-believers for Jesus, b. Establishing new believers in their faith in Christ, c. Walking with believers to a fully surrendered, heart-cleansed, fruit-bearing, and Spirit-filled life. The second thing I want to share about the change is that it is not to diminish Sunday School. I know that there are many thoughts and opinions on Sunday School. I am an advocate for Sunday School in the local church, even if it is not labelled as Sunday School. I believe the local church should offer Christian Education to believers of all ages. This time provides such an opportunity for relationships to be built, bonds to be formed, and for the Word of God to be taught.

During New Mexico District events (Man Camp, Women's Retreat, Teen Camp, Kid's Camp) we had almost 100 individuals give their heart to the Lord. This number does not reflect the total number of lives saved in the local church, nor does it include the number of individuals who rededicated their lives to Christ. One thing I believe we can say is that God is moving all across our district! I want to say thank you again to Wade Elftman for organizing and leading Man Camp and Teen Camp. Thank you to Jordin West as the NYI President and the role you play in leading the youth of the New Mexico District. Thank you DeAnn Rushing for organizing and leading Women's Retreat. Thank you to Diana Bloomquist, Ron Davis, Christa Storch, and the rest of their team for organizing and leading Kid's Camp.

Hasn't it been wonderful to be able to meet once again and to be able to hold many of our events in person! While I am thankful for the technology that is available to meet virtually, there is nothing that can replace meeting together. I do not want to take from the quizzing report, but I do want to say what a joyous sight it was to see our teens and kids gathering together to display their knowledge of the Word of God at district quiz meets. I was blown away by the way they could remember and recall scripture and what takes place in scripture! Thank you to Arthur Pacheco and Sherri Todd for leading children's quizzing across the district.

Speaking of quizzing I'd like to take a moment to make a push and promote quizzing. The New Mexico District once had a strong showing at quiz meets across the district. Since COVID, the number of teams/participants has dropped in a drastic way. I would like to encourage you, and your church to pray about quizzing. Pray for leaders, pray for willingness. We would love to see your kids and teens learning the Word of God, writing on their hearts, and learning to live it out. During our convention we will have a breakout session available on quizzing. If you're a children's leader or worker and you'd like to know more, or get valuable resources, please go to that breakout! If you're a pastor and you'd like to start/restart quizzing at your church, please go to the quizzing breakout.

I believe the future is bright for the New Mexico District. It is exciting to see and hear about the different ministries happening across the state of New Mexico and in El Paso. As I have been praying about discipleship on the New Mexico District, the Lord has led me to Romans 12:11-12, "Don't hesitate to be enthusiastic—be on fire in the Spirit as you serve the Lord! Be happy in your hope, stand your ground when you're in trouble, and devote yourselves to prayer." (CEB). I want to challenge us to start with the end of that passage. Let's devote ourselves to prayer. Let's seek out the Lord and what He wants to do in our churches and on our district. As we devote ourselves to prayer, may we be filled with the joy or enthusiasm of the Spirit. May the fire of God burn bright in our soul. I pray we will be unshakeable as we are rooted in our hope in Jesus. Lord may we be willing to serve as you call us, and may we be willing to go where you send us. Amen!

I would like to close by saying thank you to you, the New Mexico District. Thank you for being gracious with me in my first year as NDI Chairman.

We realized just how important it truly is for the youth of the church to spend time together connecting through shared experiences in Christ and how that produces within them the desire to grow in their own faith. I have seen our students and leaders be the hands and feet of Jesus this year and I highly value the times we have laughed, cried, prayed, and shared with one another and with those in our extended communities. We thank God for His faithfulness during these times and look forward to what He has in store for the future of NM NYI!

Please find below a brief summary of the events that we have participated in this year.

Teen Camp:

Our district NYI Vice President, Wade Elftman, faithfully and effectively serves as our Teen Camp director. BONITA PARK CAMP

As we give this report, great things are happening at Bonita Park!

We started last year a bit slow. As much of the nation was still trying to figure out how to move forward through the COVID pandemic, we found ourselves in the same position. We were figuring out if we could be the camp and they were figuring out if they could be the campers. We were figuring out if we could get enough food and they wanted to add an extra meal to the package. Much like you in a grocery store (except we were shopping for more than 300 campers at a time), we found that some of the favorite standards were not always available. Last summer was a bit lighter than we anticipated but as the year progressed, we received calls from more and more groups ready to get back to camp for a week or a weekend. We could sense their excitement. It's never just about coming to Bonita Park, although it is a great place to get away to. It's never just about the food, although the food is awesome and those cinnamon rolls are outstanding! It's never just about the zip line, or high ropes or nine square in the air or the amazing Leap of Faith at the even more amazing Events Center, although those things are great fun! It's about more. It's about coming away to a place to meet with their Creator. He is calling out to them. He is speaking into their lives. He is meeting them at Bonita Park and changing their lives forever. He is doing eternal work at Bonita Park. The camp served 6,961 guests this last year. Of those, we know of 370 lives that were saved and rededicated, and we have also heard that 86 campers were called into ministry!

Beyond the camper's lives being radically changed, work is being accomplished on various facilities. We have repaired wind damage a few times throughout the camp. From blown down trees being cleaned up to a portion of the roof on Morris Center being blown off and replaced, the work is never ending. A new pump was required in the main well. It sits some 400 feet below ground level so that was a bit of a project. Volunteers at the camp last year gave more than 5,800 hours of their time to serving meals, working on the grounds and helping out on projects. The Armstrong Tabernacle remodel has progressed through a couple of phases thanks to many of you who have volunteered your time and skills to help accomplish this huge undertaking on this 30 year old facility. The bathrooms have been remodeled and the new storage area is almost complete. This remodel is 100% funded by donors. The Elk Run cabins have new roofs thanks to a single generous donor!! This kind of sacrificial giving has helped to accomplish so many projects both recently and throughout the nearly 83 years the camp has been in existence. We would not be where we are today without you! Bonita Park recently held a naming ceremony at Elk Run to honor the names of those who have paved the way for the camp since its beginning. Five of those cabins are now named Ryan, Peters, Burch, Gunstream and Petty. We are so honored to be sharing those names with campers once again!

We can't say enough good things about our staff team! They are amazing!! As the camp's staff continues to carry on this great work, we humbly recognize that we are the hands and feet of Jesus. You, the District Family are also the hands and feet of Jesus through Bonita Park. Every time you come to the camp and bring someone with you who needs Jesus, or someone who needs renewing in their spirit or someone who needs a safe, quiet space to hear the voice of God speak to them, you are the hands and feet of Jesus. Every time you give financially or volunteer or pray over Bonita Park, you are the hands and feet of Jesus. Just as those who have gone before us, we pray that God will continue to use these hands and feet in ways that we can only imagine. As summer began this year, we were privileged to welcome a record setting group of 496 campers who arrived on nine charter buses! As our staff stood by the road and waved at them as they drove onto the grounds, it was overwhelming to think about cooking and serving more than 6,000 meals. It was overwhelming to think about scheduling all of the necessary slots to be filled. And, it was equally overwhelming to consider all that God would do in their lives while they were on these sacred grounds.

We pray that God will protect the camp, and we pray that He will continue to call campers to come away to this place that has been set apart for the work of the Kingdom on the New Mexico District. We are so privileged to serve this district through the ministry of Bonita Park. Respectfully submitted.





It has been abundantly clear that God has placed each family within our congregation to build a unique set of skills and passions that is tailor made for our community. It has been an honor to grow with this church and watch God put passion and drive in so many of His servants!

A look to the left: As we have continued to seek to be God's hands and feet in our community, it has been amazing to watch our church shift its focus from internal stability to external service. Many years ago, we decided to forego the typical summer vacation Bible school as we just don't have the number of volunteers that would be needed to run a weeklong VBS. However, over this past year, we have successfully hosted VBS sessions during the two elementary school parent teacher conference weeks in which students do not attend school on Thursday or Friday and many parents are left without access to affordable childcare. It has been a privilege to watch these children learn about God while their parents are being served by volunteers who genuinely love each child. For one of these families, this enabled the children to be in a supportive environment while their mother travelled to Ukraine to rescue their grandmother. This would not be possible without the burden for service that the Lord has put on the hearts of His children at La Vista.

A look to the right: I am incredibly proud of this congregation for how well they have come through a six month long pastoral transition. It has been abundantly clear that God has orchestrated this time of transition as a time of growth and learning how to operate as a church that partners in leadership and works together to continue serving the community through such a transition. I could not ask for a better board and leadership team to start my first pastorate in. I have been eternally blessed that God would create such a growth oriented and supporting environment for me to develop into a leader. The people of this church are truly a blessing!

A look forward: As La Vista moves into the coming year, we will continue to find ways to serve our community in genuine love. We are seeking God in prayer that He teach us to: See with His eyes, Hear with His ears, Love with His heart, and Act as His hands and feet. I continue to feel the weight of God's calling to a deeper prayer life and ministry within the church. 

I praise God that he has provided for our PAC pastors to report individually about the amazing things God has done. This allows me some room to report on what he is doing specifically in our ABQ Central congregation. One of our newest believers, Ernesto Martinez, has partnered with one of our long-time servant seniors, Eva Pacheco, and they have together stepped up and taken leadership in our Thrift Store and Resource Center. This is miraculous on multiple levels. God brought Ernesto to us during the COVID-19 shutdowns almost 2 years ago, so that is a miracle unto itself. He comes from a difficult past and he has quickly jumped into service in the church, expressing a call to ministry that we hope to mentor him through. Another miracle! Additionally, for many churches, a new believer and a senior adult working hand-in-hand is a seemingly unattainable dream. Although Ernesto still has room to grow and the partnership is far from perfect, God is working miracles through the process and we are excited about the future and what God can do.

God has been faithful in working through our youth leader, Rebekah Landry. She has led our teens to maturity in Christ by keeping their focus on seeing others come to know Christ and leading the teens to show the love of Christ to the unchurched. Maturity is not true maturity until it focuses on others and our youth group refuses to be ingrown. They have hosted multiple outreaches in different areas of town, including two apartment complexes. Through all of this, Rebekah has clearly heard (and finally answered) the call to vocational ministry and interviewed for her first local minister's license at the end of the church year. Additionally, she has taken leadership in Mission ABQ's new resident services department, to work part-time at one of the apartment complexes. Rebekah's husband James, one of our Core Team Pastors, has led the way in partnering with another church, Ciudad de Gracia, through the Shine partnership to do outreach connected to Emerson Elementary school, including a weekly gardening program in the school. Many Christians wonder if it is possible for the church and public schools to co-exist, but we have found the schools hungry and thirsty for spiritual help. Although the Shine partnership walks the line of church and state very carefully, we have found that the school administrators and many of the teachers recognize the need for spiritual direction as a solution to the deep challenges experienced by many of the families they serve. In the Sunday absence of Pastor James (who served as interim pastor at Mountainair) Pastor Mike Brown, spurred by an encounter with God that brough tabout some significant renewal, stepped up and took leadership in our Sunday morning Homeless ministries.

Some of our historically most successful ministries have seen outstanding success this year, perhaps taking them to another level. Our worship ministries have long been a strength of our congregation and, under the leadership of our Worship Director and multiple worship leaders, we have taken steps forward to challenge our team to greater vision and deeper desire for the presence of God in our worship services. Kingdom Builders Preschool & Day Care, long an important outreach avenue, received their 5-star rating this year and has been building a much more effective team. They also received a \$320,000 grant to help with facility and staffing costs. Finally, Pastor Dawn Davis has led our discipleship ministries forward. What has long been a strength of our church, experienced many challenges over the last few years. Pastor Dawn has an incredible heart for seeing people get connected (to the church and to other believers) and earnestly seeks out new people to draw them in while investing in long-time members and leaders and sharing the vision and importance of discipleship.



At the entry to our sanctuary, for many years, we have had our logo emblazoned with the word NEXT. This came about after several years of casting vision for what new works God was calling us to start in the coming year. Each year, there were amazing opportunities for things that we had never even envisioned...and a few things that we were "just sure" God was going to do that never quite got off the ground. Instead of focusing on the specific thing that we thought God was going to do, we began opening ourselves up to the possibilities that God might bring and saying YES before we even knew what they were. I wish I knew exactly what God had in store, but I don't. I know that it will be better than we imagined. Although many churches struggle for lack of vision, many of us declare vision that is short of all that God is capable of doing. I know that if we are willing to say yes, God will bless and he "is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us."





We are beginning to place a new emphasis on missions local, regional, as well as around the world. Whether it is through our thrift store, through VBS, Samaritan's Purse, or serving across the state and across the world, we hope to do more to share the holiness message to those who need hope.

At Aztec church, we believe that God is not done with us and there is more on the horizon. My prayer is that we are ready, willing, and able to extend the love of Christ around us. We may not be able to do it all, but we will do our part for others.



Back: When I look back on what God has done in Los Lunas Cornerstone this past year, I could say, "What hasn't He done?" By that, I mean that we have become very aware of every working of His that we see His hand in everything that has gone on in the life of the church. But there is one miraculous thing that stands out to me: the turn around that we have seen with our daycare ministry. We made a

commitment as a church 4 years ago to turn our daycare back to the Lord, and to do everything we could to make it a ministry in the name of Christ again. We have made several steps toward that goal over the past 4 years, and this year, despite what we perceived to be setbacks, God has been faithful to our commitment. He has filled our classrooms to capacity, and we were awarded the honor of being voted the Best Childcare center in Valencia County. We have heard from many of our families that they are blessed by the values and love that their children receive at the center, and we know God is working in our commitment to honor Him. As we continue to make steps to bring Christ into every corner of this ministry, we know that He will continue to show up in mighty ways.

Left: I was amazed, utterly humbled and encouraged by the way the people that God has entrusted to me to pastor rallied around me and my family when I was hospitalized. I have devoted my entire self to loving God and His people, and when the time came for His people to show His love for me and my family, we got to see the endless depths of their love for us and for all who love the Lord. We are a small church, and I worry sometimes that without a completely devoted pastor, they might not stick together, but God is bigger than my worries. He showed me something amazing about His church during that time, but just as important, He showed His church amazing things about themselves. He has been so faithful in sustaining His church through things that would break many others. His faithfulness shouldn't be surprising still, but He finds new ways of doing this time and time again.

Right: We've continued to feel prompted by God to make prayer a vibrant part of our worship and gathering time, so this past year we added a twice monthly pie & prayer night at Cornerstone. It's great! It's very informal, but it's a great way for us to gather together and join in prayer for the needs of individuals, our community, our congregation, etc. and also enjoy a time of casual fellowship. These pie & prayer times have seen people who don't normally come to "prayer meetings" come and see that corporate prayer doesn't have to be intimidating or scary, but rather another chance for the church to truly act as the body of Christ for one another.

Since we are a small congregation, we get the opportunity to be more creative with our Sunday worship time. In January we started S.O.A.P. Sundays where, instead of a traditional sermon, we gather into small groups put together and led by the Spirit to study Scripture together, talk it through, learn how to apply it, and pray for one another. God has done great things through those times!

Forward: Nearly two years ago, we felt a Spirit prompting in our whole church to begin praying for and laying the foundation to start a youth program again after nearly all of our youth left for "greener pastures." We faithfully prayed for this, and began to prepare a space in the church that would be a dedicated youth space. Then God brought us a boy scout troop that wanted to host meetings at the church on a night when we had no activities happening. We saw the opportunity to reach the lives of many young people through that program. As we've developed a relationship with them, and continued to pray for a youth program, we finally saw the connection of what God had been doing.

We are looking forward to kicking off our youth program, starting with some of the youth from the scout program at the end of the summer. We continue to pray for this, and I have stepped out in faith to lead this program and have begun to put together an idea of what that time might look like. We are excited about this time because we truly believe that a vibrant church includes spaces where all people of all ages can come and grow in *their relationship with the Lord.*



God began working in us this year inviting us to walk through the open door! We heard His call as we prayed, read His Word and sought His guidance. At the start of the school year we had a brand-new superintendent in Capitan. Throughout the 18 years I've been here we've had an open-door access to the schools and we've seen God do some marvelous things. However, the new superintendent made it clear that we were no longer welcome. We began to pray specifically about how we could break this blockade and God began to work. At first, even though we couldn't go in, students began to come, slowly at first, but more and more each week. It began to build and as it built we prayed more specifically that God would help us to be faithful to walk through the open doors regardless of what it looked like. In the middle of the school year the superintendent was dismissed from his position and the people in charge came specifically to Phil, our youth minister, and asked him to come back into the school and once again be an integral part.

When God opened doors, He left me more and more amazed at what He is doing. We believed and continue to believe that with Phil and Sherri, God was going to use them tremendously in the Capitan schools. In the early part of 2022 we received information about a program that was coming to the school, Rachel's Challenge, that would engage the students in working proactively to make their school better. The High School principal reached out to Phil inviting as many of the church members who would to come on a Wednesday evening to see what the program was about and be involved with the school. At the end of that program she asked Phil, Sherri and myself to personally be part of this challenge; to come into the school every other week, interact with the students, helping them to make their school a better place. When God opens a door, no one can shut it!

We have seen God take the last two years of pandemic and loss and bring it right to where He wants it. At Angus Church we have more that 30% of our congregation that is involved weekly in ministry to others. People give of their time and effort to make sure that the focus of what we are doing is to reach out to our community and to walk through the doors that He opens. We have had specific times of prayer where we've had more than 20 people gather for an hour to pray. We have a consistent group of people who give of their time twice a month to help get food to other people, working up to 15 hours a week to hand out food, to talk and pray with people who come to receive food. We have women and men who come in to prepare meals on Wednesday and Sunday so that children, teens and adults can be fed. We have a great number of adults who give their Wednesday evenings to work with and love teens and children. We have people who volunteer extra time each week to make sure that our audio/video and our streaming ministry is the best that it can be.

God is still opening doors as we look ahead. There are challenges that we are facing financially and still our board is committed to making ministry a priority. I believe that prayer is central and core to where we are going as we have to listen to Him and hear what He has to say before we move. We are in the process of setting up a DBJ ministry for parents of our teens and children who come on Wednesday evenings. We want to begin to help them to find the Jesus we are sharing with their children. We will begin to cover this ministry in prayer specifically for it over the next 3 months so that God can and will work in their hearts and lives preparing them even when they don't know what is ahead. God IS still opening doors and we will walk through them! It begins with walking through the door into His throne room, worshiping Him and letting Him prepare us for what He has and then walking out into the world with His directive, with His anointing and power and in His Spirit!




What has gone right this past year was a breakthrough with a parishioner. He has finally repented and returned to the Lord. I pray that he stays on the correct path this time and does not return to the past.

A look back: Jason came onto the grounds and asked me to pray for him. He was 45 years old. When I asked him what his prayer need was, he responded, "I'm going to heaven today." He was clearly suicidal. The Holy Spirit spoke to me and assigned me responsibility for him. I gave him \$9 which was all the cash I had available. I watched him as he sat down on the sidewalk, and I continued to pray for him. I watched him get up and put something under a rock on the inside of our fence. I walked out to the fence and there was my \$9 neatly tucked under the rock. He had written a note on the front of the first dollar bill which read, "I can't take this." I found him and we sat on a city bus bench and he poured out his heart to me. He had walked from Santa Fe, NM to El Paso to work for a carnival. He had been promised a job, but the job was not there, and he had been treated badly during the past 3 days by everyone he met. He was at the end of his rope. He said he had a carnival job in New Orleans, but had been trying to hitch a ride for days and no one would stop. Immediately the Spirit told me that I was responsible to get Jason to New Orleans where he had a job waiting for him. I took Jason back to the Church, got him some pants, a shirt, some underwear and a new pair of shoes. Then we drove downtown and got him a bus ticket. I told Jason that I did not want him to remember me, but that I wanted him to remember the bus ticket. I wanted him to remember the ticket because it would remind him that God knew who he was and was always watching out for him. I thank God for His Holy Spirit. I thank God for allowing me to help another person. I thank God for sending Jason to me today. I know God saved a life and a soul!

A Look to the left: We have a Community Garden which provides fresh produce to young families with children in our neighborhood. We have only been able to grow in the summer months. I have been praying for a green house. In March, a Church from Kansas purchased a greenhouse for us and then sent a team to erect it. We will now be able to grow year-round! God listens and answers prayers!

A Look to the right: We held 11 Giant Give-A-Ways this past year. We provided more than \$200,000 worth of goods to the Community. Our Clothes Closet and Food Pantry have been another blessing to the community. We have been able to lead 8 people to Jesus this year through this ministry.

A Look forward: The Imagine Church held it's first service on April 2^{nd} . We have been "meeting needs, making friends, and now are connecting these friends with God!" Our community is responding to God's love and now people who were recipients have become volunteers – helping others.



This past year has been a great experience being able to share Jesus with those who are at their end-of-life journey. It becomes more apparent to many hospice patients at the end of life that what happens to the soul is important.

One of those stories is about a patient I met during my chaplain ministry. All our patients are assigned to individual chaplains and my purpose for taking on this specific patient was to calm him down and keep him in hospice. Who would have thought that a friendship would bloom from this encounter. This patient was as former Muslim but during his time in America he has been seeking the truth. I shared with him the story of Jesus Christ, and his wife who is a Christian, would nod in agreement with what I was sharing. The patient's biggest question was "How can a loving God love and forgive someone like me?" From this point on and every visit after I was able to share about God's great mercy on his children. On Sundays when the patient felt well enough to travel he and his wife would attend church at Rio Vista. Other times he would watch the live stream. At the end of his life he was filled with peace and joy and would tell me often that our first visit was not an accident but was perfect timing from the Lord. After this patient passed away, his wife started attending the Rio Vista Church and has since become a member of the congregation.

This is one of many stories we can tell you in chaplain ministry. Although challenging at times, it never stops being a blessing to serve.

During this past assembly year, I have continued serving as a hospice chaplain for Kindred Hospice in New Mexico in Lea County. Part of my hospice responsibilities have included providing spiritual care and emotional support to terminal patients and their families. Numerous hospice visits have been made, and ongoing grief support group meetings have been conducted. The attendance at grief support meetings has increased to an average of 20 seeking grief support. Also, grief support letters have been mailed each month to bereaved patient families. Several funeral services were conducted for patient families, and funeral services for the community. I have attended weekly interdisciplinary hospice meetings that included Physicians and clinicians. Quite often, I have provided pastoral care and emotional support to the other hospice team members. I have been leading a weekly group prayer meeting with my other Kindred Hospice team members.

Occasionally I have been called upon to translate for our Spanish-speaking patients.

Apart from my hospice duties I also served a part-time ministry role at Northgate Church of Hobbs, NM. Where I have preached many sermons, and Sunday School lessons. I made pastoral visits to parishioners both in hospitals, homes, skilled nursing facilities, and independent living facilities.

Also, since New Year's Eve we have been hosting a Spanish-speaking congregation in our church facility.

Between hospice and church ministry some have accepted faith in Christ; while some have been encouraged during one of the most crucial times of their lives.


