A Tale of Two Caves

Over twenty years ago, when I had the opportunity to visit Israel, we visited the church in Bethlehem that is built over the place that is believed to have been the birthplace of Jesus. I was surprised to learn that the stable that Jesus was born it was not a wooden stable like we often imagine. It was not a barn, or a horse shed, or anything that we would normally refer to as a stable. The problem is, there is not much wood in the hills surrounding Jerusalem. Most the area has been deforested by years of armed conflict. Most the buildings, in fact, are made of stone. There are very few wooden structures at all. So, when Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem to discover that there was no place for them to stay, they were led to a cave, that was part of a cave system that housed animals, stored goods, and a crying newborn, who was wrapped in stable cloth and laid to rest in a feed trough that had been hollowed out of a large stone. From that cave in Bethlehem, came the One who would be the presence of God in the world, bring light, life, and renewal to broken people—salvation.

Lately, I have been reading The Passion Translation for my devotions. In Luke 23:50ff

There was also a member of the Jewish council named Joseph, from the village of Ramah, a good hearted and honorable man who was eager for God's kingdom to appear. He had strongly disagreed with the decision of the council to crucify Jesus. He came before Pilate and asked permission to take the body of Jesus for a proper burial, and Pilate granted his request. So he took the body from the cross, wrapped it in a winding sheet of linen, and placed it in an new, unused tomb chiseled out of solid rock.

I don't exactly know why it hit me in that moment, but it occurred to me that Jesus began his life in a cave and ended his life in a cave, because there was no other place for him. Simply due to the kindness of strangers, a place was made for Jesus to rest. Both places carved out of solid rock. And out of both caves, came God's presence that was sent into the world to bring light, life, and renewal to broken people—salvation.

As I thought about these truths, I began to think of the word CAVE itself and how it stands for many of the gifts of God to the world.

C= He came, He comes, He conquers, Compassion, Care,... (What comes to your mind?)

A= Atonement, Authority, Answers, ... (What else comes to your mind?)

V= Victory, vicarious, Vine, Violence (there was violence that surrounded Jesus both times), ... (What else comes to your mind?)

E= Everlasting Life, Enters our life/heart; Jesus is the End of all things; He is our everything... (What else comes into your mind?)

There is one other cave that I want to talk about before I am done. It is found in Luke 23:23

But the people and the high priests, shouting like a mob, screamed out at the top of their lungs, "No! Crucify him! Crucify him!" Finally their shouts and screams succeeded. Pilate <u>caved</u> in to the crowd and ordered that the will of the people be done.

Pilate's cave is cold, dark, and empty. He caved into the will of the crowd and ordered the crucifixion of a man that he knew was innocent.

Pilate's response to the crowd puts us all on notice. While Jesus came to offer life, life, and healing in the world, there will always be those who try to shout down our confidence in him. If we are not careful and sure in our own belief about him, we can find ourselves bending to the will of the crowd. His two caves can be our victory in this world and the one to come, or our cave can cause us to lose all hope, respect, and miss out on the things that Jesus can do in and for our lives.

Will you be one to cave or will you be changed by the one who came out of the cave to bring you light, life, and salvation?




