It's 2:00 a.m. I'm wide awake. I slip out of bed and try to stumble in the dark to find my clothes as quietly as I can. Nevertheless, Lisa wakes and says, sleepily, "What are you doing?" "I can't sleep," I say, "I think I need to go to the hospital and see Mr. W. I can't get him off my mind. Maybe tonight is the night." She yawns and says, "OK, I understand. Try to be home before the children have to go to school."

In the next few moments, I run a brush through my mouth and hair and set off into the morning chill to find my way into the hospital simply because I have a since that the Lord is sending me. Lisa knows the routine. It has unfolded dozens of times either because I had a feeling or because I got a phone call. Off into the darkness I went to serve God's people and to try to be the presence of Christ in the early morning darkness because I understand that when the curtain between heaven and earth gets thin, people want their pastor there to steady their feet and to help them to see Jesus.

These and a thousand other personal inconveniences that often solicited a sentence to my children that began with the words, "I'm sorry, but..." are part of what it means for someone to enter into the ministry. We don't take these duties on because we are paid well (pastors are probably the worst-paid professionals of any). We don't do it because we are gluttons for punishment. We don't do it because it is easy (pastoral ministry is one of the three highest stress occupations of all).

We do these things because God has called out of the lineup of His children and has asked us to care for His church. God in His divine plan and purpose has put his finger on our life and has asked us to be His hands and feet in caring for His bride. We have been called to this work. So, we prepare. We pray. We surrender. We sacrifice. We are examined. We offer ourselves. And we serve. We do so, often for little or no pay. Yet, we would not trade this life for the world.

This calling invites us into some of the most sacred spaces in the world—spaces where people are married, buried, born, born-again, broken, healed, lost, found, emptied, made whole again, baptized, dedicated, daring, and delivered. This life gives us a front row seat to the miraculous, the glories of God, and the goodness of His people.

So, during Clergy Appreciation Month, remember what your pastors have given up in order to give all to serve you. When you think of how to honor them, think of all the times they entered into your deepest and darkest moments and were there in the silence, letting Jesus flow through them to let you know you were loved. Do something to return the love this month for them, simply because there is no better blessing in this world than having someone to call "pastor."

#### Jesus Film Ministry Update:

Rusty continues to wear many hats. He is handling finances and focusing on registering Jesus Film teams for next year. The process starts with District Superintendents (DS) requesting teams as part of their church growth strategy. Their involvement is crucial as Bible study groups (Preaching Points) need the mentorship and leadership of the DS to result in the growth and discipleship of the believers.

The DS's are requesting a **10% increase in the number of teams**. Last year 221 teams, this year the request is for 245 teams made up of 2-3 people - including two countries where we have **never had teams** - **Spain and Italy**.


