However, in watching the behavior of the hummingbirds, not everyone gets fed equally. While there is plenty of nectar that is provided by the generosity of my wife. And, while the supply is inexhaustible. Lisa will make more as soon as they run out. We have observed that there are certain hummingbirds that seem to do nothing all day but keep the other hummingbirds from getting a drink. These bullies actually sit on a branch or wire nearby and, when one of the 'unworthy' birds come to get a drink, they chase them off with dives, noise, and displays of their tailfeathers. There is plenty for everyone and more where that came from, but certain dominant birds have to try to hog it all for themselves, even though they don't seem to be eating any of the nectar themselves.

Watching this bird-world unfold reminded me of how the church can be at times. We too have received an endless supply of grace, mercy, peace, and love from God who delights to see us gather at the feeding place. There is more than enough of the gifts of God to go around and plenty more where that came from. Nevertheless, I have often seen churches treat outsiders with suspicion and try to retain the good gifts of God for themselves. It is as though they are afraid that if they are generous toward outsiders, they may run out of everything that God has provided that they so enjoy.

I wonder if we could find ways during these days of struggle to help our people see behind the windowpane. Perhaps we can be thinking about how we will begin now to prepare for an influx of new hummers as the church begins to open up again. Maybe we can help our gate keepers to develop an attitude of bounty and generosity instead of scarcity and control. One thing that I am sure of is that moving forward will require us to have an "everyone is welcome here" posture to our churches and ministries. Maybe these days of separation will help us to long for the days when every bird will be gathering again at the feeder, with no one trying to set boundaries about who gets in and who must stay away.

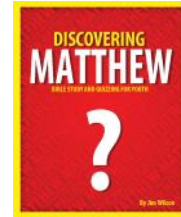

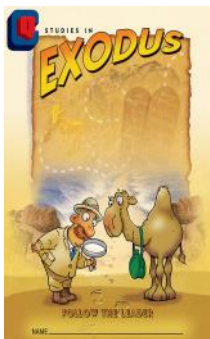

Pastors and SDMI leaders,

Historically, churches have provided monthly statistical reports to their district with at least three key figures: average worship attendance, average Sunday school attendance, and the responsibility list. Each district then reported these numbers to the SDMI office at the Global Ministry Center each month.

I have received communications that the **SDMI office in the Global Ministry Center will no longer be requesting monthly SDMI statistics from the districts in the USA and Canada region.** The only statistical reporting to the GMC will be through the Annual Pastors Report.

Dr. Lacher and I have discussed this topic, and have agreed that we will no longer ask our churches to report the monthly SDMI Statistics to the NM District for at least the rest of the 2020 – 2021 church year.

Thanks to those who have worked so diligently in the past to gather and provide the SDMI Statistics. I appreciate all the hard work you have been doing.

In addition, Dr. Lacher recently sent a note to pastors giving an update that “Our governor has allowed Houses of Worship to open to 40% of capacity. Please remember that 40% capacity means 40% of the capacity of the room in which you are meeting.” Dr. Lacher goes on to point out that this may allow many of our churches to restart Sunday School.

Teen Quizzers Virtual Quizzing Guidelines (to be elaborated on in future communications):

****Each student will need to be logged into Zoom on their own separate device (one per student, not per team). The video component of Zoom must be utilized at all times while a quiz is taking place. Free Zoom accounts are available at zoom.us.

****Students will type their assigned number (given at the beginning of each quiz) into the chat function on Zoom and when they desire to "jump" to answer a question, they will simply hit enter. The quizmaster will unmute the individual who "jumps" first and call on them. As always, if the quizmaster has not finished the question, the student will need to do so before giving their answer.

****WiFi connection will inevitably be an issue, so please consider where it is best for your students to login. If there are multiple people on one internet connection, it may slow it down.
