



What You Can and Can't Control

My personal devotional reading has cycled me back around to the book of Revelation and have been reminded of these words which seem so appropriate for us individually and as the church today.

⁹I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus.¹⁰ On the Lord's Day I was in the Spirit, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet, (NIV).

If we pick these two verses apart, I think we can find some important perspectives that we need to hear.

First, let's look at what John could not control.

He could not control the suffering that he and his friends were experiencing.

Like you, I have become so weary of this COVID business and all the losses we are experiencing. My heart aches for every pastor and church as I hear report after report of Covid-related deaths, hospitalizations, and the like. As I hear how pastors have to cancel services again and again due to Covid spikes in their communities, or preach to empty chairs because so many are afraid to come out in this mess, my heart aches for what we are going through. I wonder when enough is going to be enough. It seems that every day we hear of another loss, another hospitalization, another positive test, another shut down, another cancellation, another disappointment, another reason to weep with those who weep. John's lesson to us here is simply to join in the companionship of suffering. We can't control this pandemic. We can try to manage it somewhat. Yet, what we need more than anything is simply to reach out to each other and remind one another that they are not alone. We walk in *together* in the *companionship of suffering* because we dare not allow anyone we love to walk alone.

He could not control the place of exile where he was located.

Another effect of this pandemic is that it has brought such separation from the things and the people that we love. I know people who have hardly left their homes in two years. Others only go out to essential places. We are sick of masks and social distancing. We are tired of being forced to vaccinate and hyperventilate. Work and Witness has ground to a halt. Mission deployments have been delayed. Many people have been unable to travel to see loved ones in more than two years. Others have lived through seasons of quarantine time and again. We are tired of this season of exile, but, like John, it is simply out of our control. So,

Now, let's look at what John determined he could control.

He controlled his commitment to the Christian community.

I love the way this conversation begins, "I John, your brother and companion...". Here is a man who is suffering and in exile, but he has not forgotten his identity. His identity was not formed by his suffering. Neither was his identity formed by his location. His identity was formed by his relationship to Jesus and to the church. He was all alone on Patmos, but he still has brothers and sisters in the church. He was on a deserted island, but he was not a deserted person. He had companionship as long as he had a connection to the people of God.

This is not a time to allow your connections to the church to grow slack. In fact, you need the church more than ever. And, even if you feel that you can go it alone, the church needs you. Our strength comes in companionship and brotherhood (and sisterhood). An army of one is not sufficient to face the trials that we are in. Reconnect to family, if you have drifted due to this season of separation.

He controlled his attitude toward his current situation.

John described his attitude as "patient endurance." Sometimes that's all we have. It would be great if "every day was a holiday" but we are not in that season. We are in a season that calls for the deep, settled, soul of patient endurance. Patient endurance comes from a place of rooted confidence in God who will never leave us without hope or without help. It draws from the well of experience from a relationship with God that gives us confidence. God has never failed us and He is not about to start failing us now. They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength (Is. 40:31). Patient endurance comes from the sheep who know the Shepherd who comes even in the valley of the shadow of death to comfort, protect, and to provide.

He controlled how he would spend his Sundays: *On the Lord's Day I was in the Spirit*

John was on Patmos. He couldn't go to church. There were no churches on Patmos. There were not even any other Christians on Patmos. There was no one taking attendance. He could not earn a Sunday School pin by going to Sunday School. He was a one-man-congregation. So, what did he do? He worshipped. It was "the Lord's Day"—Sunday. Therefore, John spent the day "in the Spirit." He was committed to spending Sunday with Jesus (period). And, because he was focused on Jesus, not on his sufferings; focused on Jesus, not on his circumstances; focused on Jesus, not on the church; focused on Jesus, not on the Roman empire that had treated him so unfairly; focused on Jesus, not on what others were doing; focused on Jesus, not on his isolation from other Christians; because he was focused on Jesus on the Lord's Day, heaven opened up to him and he saw unutterable mysteries that still confound us to this day.

Ancient lessons for a modern church. The wisdom of God for the people of God.


Alabaster Story | Kenya Eastern District Center

Thanks to a God-given vision, a united district, focused leaders, and an Alabaster offering, the Kenya Eastern District and Training Centre (KEDTC) is finished! God is already using the new facility for His glory, allowing people from across the district to create new music, train, meet, worship, and grow together. The neatly painted, wooden-sided building provides space for at least 48 pastors and lay leaders who attend training programs and seminars and serves as housing during the events. The space also hosts a local radio station and a recording studio where people record songs and sermons. All the district ministries have offices there as well.

Once it was time to build, church members gave water and sand to the construction, skilled and unskilled labor, and furnishings and finances. Their work was paired with a significant gift of Alabaster funds. Rev. Augustus Musili, the district superintendent of the Kenya Eastern District, said the united effort from members across the district “. . . presented us with an enhanced picture of who we are as a church. We have a heart to pursue the Great Commission.”

The Church of the Nazarene began work in Kenya in 1984. In 1985, missionary Harmon Schmelzenbach III came to Kenya to explore opportunities for church planting and began by inviting a few families to a house fellowship that grew into a church, Nairobi Central Church of the Nazarene. INFORMATION

We are excited that again this year we will have a craft fair at our retreat. The craft fair is an excellent opportunity for your local ladies to display their many wonderful crafts for sale during the open times at the retreat.

Why not get a group of your ladies to join together, combine their efforts and share one or two tables. A portion of the table's sales then could go to your local ladies ministries. You decide, you may want to establish a local ladies retreat scholarship fund for future retreats.

The craft fair is not limited to homemade crafts, however, because of state health laws, we will not be able to have homemade baked goodies for sale at our fair. Nor is it a "garage sale". However, "THINK OUTSIDE THE BOX" when it comes to what you want to offer for sale at our craft fair. In the past we have had Avon ladies, Tupperware and other trade vendors. Because we are a fairly small craft fair, we will need to limit this to only one vendor from each business. Reservations will be on a FIRST COME FIRST SERVED basis.

We will have our craft fair in the Morris Center Fireplace Room. The fair will be open any hours that Morris Center is open. You can have your table open during meal times, including breakfast. The fair will be closed during services, so plan to bring a bed sheet or a large table cloth to cover your table when you will not be able to be there to attend to it.

You will be able to set up your table and open it anytime on Friday. The tables will be arranged and labeled with a table number on them. **When you arrive at the retreat come to the registration table in Armstrong Tabernacle. There, you will be able to pay for your table and get your table assignment.**

Because of the limited space and number of tables we have available, we may need to limit the number of tables to no more than one(1) per vendor. If you can bring your own table let me know ahead of time. Individuals sharing a craft table will be considered as one (1) vendor.

Also, remember that space is limited so be careful about tall or large displays that may interfere with the crafter next to you.

SILENT AUCTION

Friday, March 25, 2022 and Saturday, March 26, 2022

We are planning on having our Silent Auction again this year. This is a very important and vital part of our retreat. The proceeds from this event will go to a mission project selected by the District Women's Ministries.

Our silent auction will not be the typical silent auction. We will be having a **"Gift Basket Silent Auction"**. If possible, we would like to have at least one basket from each of our churches on the district. When you say to me "Gift Basket" I immediately think of fruit baskets. Not this time. Let's really think outside the box. I have provided a list of possible baskets. Because of health and food laws we cannot have any homemade or baked goods type of baskets. However, we can have shelf stable prepackaged food items.

We want all sizes of baskets – small, medium, large and a few extra-large. The easiest way to wrap a basket is to use a preformed basket shape "shrink wrap bag". It must say "shrink wrap" on the outside of the package. This is a cellophane shrink wrap bag that you set the basket inside, tie a ribbon around the top, and then use a hair dryer to shrink wrap securely around basket. These come in all sizes from small to extra-large. They are clear or colored transparent wrap. This wrap also comes in rolls of wrap. The best size we have found for our baskets are small, medium or large. I have some baskets, most of them small to medium. I do need the wrap for them. If you can find some in your town let me know – call me 575-937-2860 or email me rdano101@yahoo.com. I believe Hobby Lobby and Michaels have them and so do other craft stores. I am planning on attaching a small card to each basket listing the contents of the basket. This will make it easier for the ladies to decide if they want to bid on a basket.

Ideas for baskets

Kitchen gadgets basket – small gadgets for the kitchen

Bath gift basket – towels, wash cloths, soap and other bath products

Coffee and tea baskets – small packets of coffees, teas, small tea strainer, coffee mugs, etc.

Oil and vinegar basket – a small glass oil and vinegar set with a bottle of good oil and a bottle of good vinegar.

Gardening basket – small gardening tools, seeds and other gardening supplies.

Chocolates basket – A variety of good chocolates, both bars and individual candies.

Spice and seasoning basket – small bottles of spices and seasonings with usage chart.

A collection of cookbooks – especially old and out of print books. Not just new books.

Other books – Be sure all books are in good condition with no pages missing.

Small office and desk supplies – note pads, stapler, pencils, pens, pencil sharpener, etc.

Arts and crafts basket – small art and crafts supplies.

Sewing basket – sewing supplies, needles, scissors, thread, pins, etc.

Baby supplies basket – all kinds of baby supplies.

Video/movies and popcorn basket – Good movies/videos and popcorn packets.

We will close the auction during the dinner hour Saturday night and immediately announce the winning bid. The winner then will be able to pay for and take the basket with her. Everything will be closed by the end of the dinner hour. No late night actions as in past years.
